WATER SUPPLY LINE

The city council has awarded the construction contract on the Potwin/Whitewater Water Supply Line to Beachner Construction. They submitted the low bid of \$301,000.62. Construction is scheduled to begin April 11th. Whitewater has received a \$429,600.00 grant from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The HUD Region 7 office received grant applications for \$70,000,000.00. They were able to fund only \$17,000,000.

CABLEVISION

Tyson Logan Cable Incorporated has obtained all necessary permits and will be laying cable within the next few weeks. WHITEWATER MEMORIAL LIBRARY

There were 8,711 books checked out of the Whitewater Memorial Library in 1982. There were 621 additional books added, bringing the total book count to 8,107. Story Hour for pre-schoolers is held each month excluding the summer months. The theme of last years Summer Reading Club was "The Wild West". There were 131 children registered for the program. The library will have a Summer Reading Program again this year. The Summer Film Series will be continued for the fifth summer. The program runs for six weeks beginning in early June. Total attendance for last years series was 235. One of the libraries special events for 1982 was an autograph party for Mary Frerking, introducing her book of poetry entitled "Thoughts at Random". One of this years special events will be an open house on June 5th. The paintings of Dr. Francis Allen will be on display. Mr. and Mrs. Robert Lamb donated a micro fische reader to the library. This provides an extensive listing of material and books available not only from South Central Kansas Library System but state wide. The library also has available for check out a film projector and art work.
