The original business at 223 S. Main in Whitewater, KS was founded by the Zuercher family. It was then sold to Bob Entz, who then sold it to Sam Ravenscraft in 1962, when it became Ravenscraft Oil and Implement. Sam ran the company until 1976, when he sold it to his son, Jay. In 1979 it was incorporated under the name of Ravenscraft Implement, Inc. When Jay purchased the business he continued to operate primarily as an Allis-Chalmers dealer. He took on the Kubota line in 1994, and in 1997 it became the primary focus of sales and the Allis line was gradually phased out. We now handle Kubota tractors and implements, Land Pride implements, Grasshopper lawn-mowers, Woods implements, and Bush Hog implements.

We have a full service repair shop with three top grade mechanics. They have over 70 years combined experience and we believe they can fix just about anything. We have a total of 10 full time and 2 part time employees. Our parts department can furnish anything from nuts and bolts to repairing hydraulic hoses. Our parts/service manager, Ron Ferry has been with the company since 1990, and knows the parts and equipment "inside out".

U.S.D. #206 Remington School District

U.S.D. #206 is a 3A school district serving approximately 530 K – 12 students. Of the 295 school districts in the state of Kansas, Remington is currently 147th in student enrollment.

U.S.D. #206 covers 253 square miles in Butler, Harvey, Sedgwick, and Marion counties. The district operates three attendance centers: Remington Elementary in Potwin (Grades K – 4), Remington Middle in Whitewater (Grades 5 – 8) and Remington High in rural Whitewater (Grades 9 – 12). The district is a member of the Butler County Special Education Cooperative for special education services and is a member of the South Central Kansas Educational Service Center in Clearwater and the Education Services and Staff Development Association of Central Kansas in Hutchinson.

Through the districts affiliation with the Heart of America League, the middle and high school students are provided the following extracurricular activities and athletics: instrumental and vocal music, academic contests, scholar's bowl, debate and forensics, basketball, cross country, football, golf, volleyball, wrestling and track.

The district employs 50.5 certified employees and 24.3 classified employees. Twenty-three of our certified employees have achieved or exceeded a Master's degree in an educational field. Our teachers have served children a combined 679 years for an average tenure of just over 14 years. This long-term commitment to our children is due in large part to the tremendous support for education in our community.

The Remington School District is currently led by Board President – K. John Klaassen, Vice-President – Doug Claassen, and members Jayne Carey, Bret Mosiman, Tom Sommers, Jeff Toews and Mark Zonnefeld. District administrators are Jason Marciano, Principal at Remington Elementary, Bruce Krase, Principal at Remington Middle, Tim Bumgarner, Principal at Remington High and James Regier, Superintendent of Schools.

SW Butler Road between K-254 and Parallel Road

February 3, 2010

Be advised that Butler County is planning a bridge replacement project on SW Butler Rd. over the Whitewater Creek near Benton, Kansas. In order to facilitate construction of the new bridge and road reconstruction work near the bridge, SW Butler Rd will be closed from K-254 highway north to Parallel Rd. 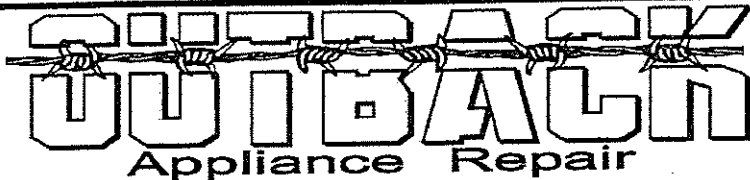

GRACE HILL WINERY

Grace Hill Winery's humble beginnings can be traced back to 2003 when Wichita physicians David and Natalie Sollo purchased 160 acres of farmland just west of Whitewater, a few miles away from where Natalie's grandparents farmed for many years. (Natalie's uncle had actually worked on the land in a threshing team prior to World War II. Later, Clayton and Virginia McClure lived on the land for almost 50 years, operating a small farming operation and hosting the 4H club.)

Looking for an ideal setting to grow grapes, the southern exposure of the small 8 acre parcel adjacent to Grace Hill Road looked just perfect to the Sollos. The land seemed to have everything important for a successful winery: history, family, community connections, and beauty. When farmer Willard Wiebe said that the topsoil was pretty thin and there were a lot of rocks in the field, we knew this was indeed the ideal location for raising grapevines.

The first vines were planted under the silo in the spring of 2004 while we readied the Big Vineyard (the 8 acre parcel) to the south. Plantings have continued every year through 2009, when the last of the vines were planted. We now have 7 major varieties represented in our 3500 vines on the property consisting of roughly equal numbers of reds and whites.

Grace Hill Winery opened its doors for business in June of 2008 and has been serving delicious, locally grown, estate produced and bottled wine ever since. We feel fortunate to have had extensive Whitewater community support for our winery. We would like to thank the folks at Ravenscraft for fixing all the things we manage to break, Josh Lago for his assistance in the vineyard and quick wit, all the people who have come out to help with harvest, and everyone else in the Whitewater community who have been so supportive of us. Most of all though, we are thankful to all of those members of the Whitewater community who come out to our winery and enjoy the wines!

We have big plans for 2010. We have just received a government matching grant to purchase a large tent in which we will be able to host events. We will be releasing some wonderful new wines in the spring which could satisfy both those who love very dry wine as well as those looking for something as sweet as honey. Look for V (pronounced Vee), Prairie Pink, and Chloe's Cuvee. Our 2009 Norton and 2008 Barrel 10 Chambourcin should delight dry wine lovers as well. Our community favorites of Dodging Tornadoes and Seyval are still available too. So come on out! We'd love to see you! 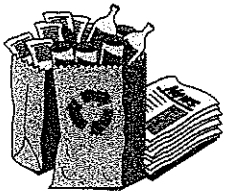

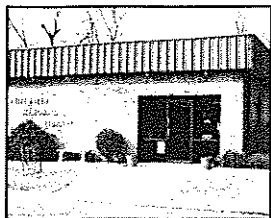

> **Late fee** is \$1/day

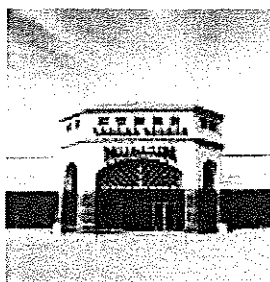
> **Lost Pass Fee** is \$75

The animal control report and court docket for March were presented.

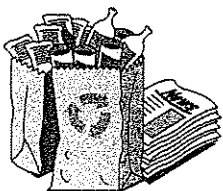

Whereas, child abuse and neglect can be reduced by making sure each family has the support they need to raise their children in a healthy environment;

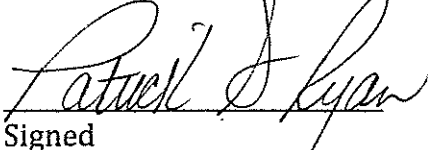

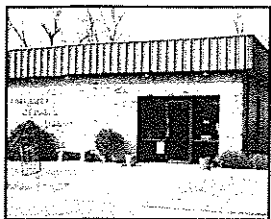
Whereas, together we can strengthen families and prevent child abuse right from the start;

2011. A new tag may be picked up anytime.**

CITY OF WHITEWATER ANIMAL CONTROL REGULATIONS

Animals means all vertebrate and invertebrate animals such as but not limited to bovine cattle, horses, hogs, goats, dogs, cats, rabbits, sheep, chickens, ducks, geese, turkeys, pigeons and other fowl or wild animals, reptiles, fish, bees or birds that have been tamed, domesticated or captivated.

2-112. Noisy Animals. The keeping or harboring of any animal which by loud, frequent and habitual barking, howling, yelping, mewling, roaring or screeching shall disturb the peace of any neighborhood is hereby prohibited. It shall be the duty of any person harboring or keeping such loud or noisy animal or animals to abate the condition, and if he or she fails to do so, the city may abate it by taking up, impounding and/or disposing of the animal at the expense of the owner.

2-116. Running at large. It shall be unlawful for any person to willfully allow any animal or fowl under his or her control to be or to run at large within the city. A animal or fowl found at large shall be impounded as provided in Section 2-117 or 2-206.

AT LARGE means to be outside of a fence or other enclosure which restrains the animal at a particular premise or not under the control, by leash or lead, of the owner or other authorized person capable of restraining the animal.

2-201. Registration and vaccination required. Every owner of any dog or cat three months old shall annually register with the City Clerk his or her name and address with the name, sex and description of each dog or cat owned and kept within the city. It shall be unlawful for the owner of any newly acquired dog or cat or any dog or cat brought into the city to fail to register such animal within 30 days from acquisition or bringing the dog or cat into the city. It shall be unlawful for the owner of any previously registered cat or dog to fail to maintain current registration of such dog or cat.

Upon registration the owner shall present a current, completed certificate of immunization against rabies. No registration shall follow without evidence of this document, and it shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog or cat over six months of age to fail to maintain effective rabies immunization of such dog or cat.

The owner or harbinger of any dog shall, at the time of registering such dog or cat, present to the city clerk a certificate from an accredited veterinarian show that a male cat or dog has been neutered or a female dog or cat has been spayed, if the animal has been neutered or spayed.

The city clerk shall collect an annual registration fee of \$5.00 for each neutered male and for each spayed female dog or cat, and \$10.00 for each unneutered male and for each unsplayed female dog or cat.

The registration year shall be from June 1st through May 31st of the following year.

When a dog or cat is registered, the city clerk will issue a tag for the animal. This tag must be attached to the dog's collar. If a tag is lost during a registration period, a duplicate tag will be issued for a fee of \$1.00.

The fine for a dog without a current tag is \$10.00, plus court costs of \$50.00. The fine for a dog running at large is \$15.00, plus court costs of \$50.00. For the second and all subsequent offenses, the fine is \$50.00, plus court costs of \$50.00.

It took me forever to come up with a name. I wanted it to be catchy. When I was growing up my

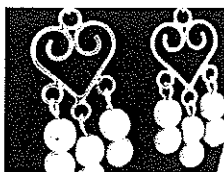
friends and family called me Lizzard and I wear glasses, so that's how the name came about! My father-in-law drew the lizard and a friend designed my business cards and website banner.

I have received many favorable comments about the building renovation at 119 South Main. The first phase is nearing completion. With this and other buildings on Main Street being used again, we can all appreciate the new boost of activity in our community.

I have received questions about the need for the Fire Department office. I am always glad for an opportunity to address any questions or concerns relating to the Fire Department. The Fire Department has always needed an office. The Fire Chiefs have all used home offices. Though not ideal, the option has worked in the past. However, for the last seven years, the office has been six miles from the Fire Station. That is really not an acceptable arrangement.

There are several considerations affecting the option to have an office as it is now. 1) There is no space in the fire station for an office. 2) In 1999, the Fire Department became an independent Fire District and is no longer under the jurisdiction of the City Council. The Fire District has an agreement with the City of Whitewater for the use of the truck bay area of the building. 3) There are more demands on administration due to governmental regulatory requirements. More space is necessary than most houses can assume. 4) We have the fewest daytime Responders available now than we have had in the past. This reason alone would make it necessary for me to be closer to the station for a quicker response. 5) Accessibility to the office is necessary for maintaining contact with Responders and resource personnel. 6) No additional taxes will be required to maintain the office.

I invite you to come by the new office. I intend to be in the office Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 8 to 5. However, needs at the Whitewater or Elbing stations, various meetings, and emergency calls may take me out of the office at any time. If you stop during one of those times, please try again.

The mission of Wheat State Manor, Inc. is to be a community health care resource commissioned by the owner churches to meet the needs of its residents and their families and to serve the residents in the Whitewater and Potwin area.

Wheat State Manor is owned by nine (9) area churches and is one of the largest employers in the community with an average of 90 to 100 employees. We are a Medicare / Medicaid facility licensed for sixty-five (65) beds. The manor is also contracted with the Veterans Administration to serve those veterans needing long term nursing home care. Currently, there are sixty-two (62) residents residing at the manor.

Wheat State Manor is thankful for the volunteer service provided by the area residents, auxiliary, churches and pastors. This is an important part of the continuum of care for the residents and provides contact for them with those in the community.

In 1971, the community became aware of the need for a nursing facility in the area. They received donations of land and funds from sponsoring churches and community members to make the idea a reality.

In 1990, the facility began an expansion and remodeling project. This included the addition of Hall 4, the family dining room, quiet room, relocating resident rooms and remodeling offices. In 2006, the nurses' desk was updated and relocated and the Friendship Parlor was created.

Michael Smith, Administrator joined the staff in January 2010 and is working on the current project of an addition to and remodeling of Sunflower Lane, the dementia and Alzheimers' unit. The project will include the construction of four (4) rooms on the north end of Hall 1 and increase the bed count from twelve (12) beds to fourteen (14) beds. The remodeling will increase the activity, dining and living areas of the unit and provide an outside entrance and a walking garden. The shower room will be updated and will include a new bathing system.

Visitors and family members are encouraged to come visit the residents at any time. You are always welcome to come and participate in the scheduled activities.

Wheat State Manor Dedicated April 7, 1974

The mission of Wheat State Manor, Inc. is to be a community health care resource commissioned by the owner churches to meet the needs of its residents and their families and to serve the residents in the Whitewater and Potwin area.

Wheat State Manor is owned by nine (9) area churches and is one of the largest employers in the community with an average of 90 to 100 employees. We are a Medicare / Medicaid facility licensed for sixty-five (65) beds. The manor is also contracted with the Veterans Administration to serve those veterans needing long term nursing home care. Currently, there are sixty-two (62) residents residing at the manor.

Wheat State Manor is thankful for the volunteer service provided by the area residents, auxiliary, churches and pastors. This is an important part of the continuum of care for the residents and provides contact for them with those in the community.

In 1971, the community became aware of the need for a nursing facility in the area. They received donations of land and funds from sponsoring churches and community members to make the idea a reality.

In 1990, the facility began an expansion and remodeling project. This included the addition of Hall 4, the family dining room, quiet room, relocating resident rooms and remodeling offices. In 2006, the nurses' desk was updated and relocated and the Friendship Parlor was created.

Michael Smith, Administrator joined the staff in January 2010 and is working on the current project of an addition to and remodeling of Sunflower Lane, the dementia and Alzheimers' unit. The project will include the construction of four (4) rooms on the north end of Hall 1 and increase the bed count from twelve (12) beds to fourteen (14) beds. The remodeling will increase the activity, dining and living areas of the unit and provide an outside entrance and a walking garden. The shower room will be updated and will include a new bathing system.

Visitors and family members are encouraged to come visit the residents at any time. You are always welcome to come and participate in the scheduled activities.

Council Meetings are held the 4th Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at the City Building and are open to the public.

The Whitewater Locker was built in 1944 and '45 by Bob Keener and sponsored by the Claypool Farm Bureau. When completed, it was sold to Clyde & Eunice Stark. They operated in until June 12, 1956, when it was sold to Blaine & Elizabeth Bowlin.

Blaine and Elizabeth ran it until 1991 when it was purchased by their son Scott, who had worked in the business since 1975. Scott, along with his wife, Terre, son Brandon, and three employees continue to operate the business. It is a custom slaughter/processing plant but has substantial retail business as well. Animals are taken by appointment only, with the locker usually booking six months to one year in advance.

The Whitewater Locker is now in it's 54th year of continuous operation by the Bowlin Family taking pride in producing a quality product.

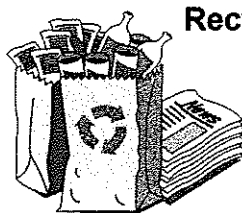

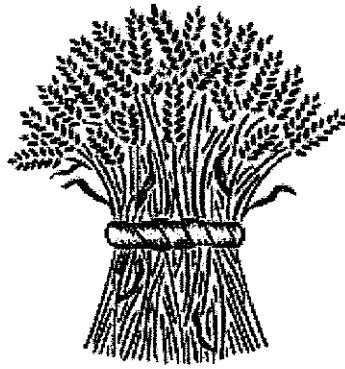

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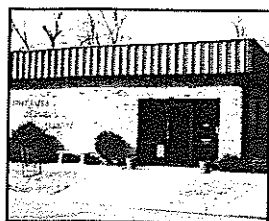

The library's current computer system, Winnebago Spectrum, was sold to another company in recent years and is no longer being upgraded or supported.

Along with 14 other South Central Kansas libraries, Whitewater Memorial Library will upgrade to a new computer system called Polaris on **November 18, 2010**. Being a part of this consortium allows for bargaining power in the areas of price and features.

Since Polaris is web-based rather than locally hosted like Winnebago Spectrum, there are many advantages

for both patrons and staff.

Since neither the library director nor library staff are trained computer techs, the most obvious benefit for library employees is the fact that all of the "technical stuff" will be handled by Polaris technicians.

Polaris Offers Convenience



Last month's newsletter article in this place announced that *the library's current computer system, Winnebago Spectrum, was sold to another company in recent years and is no longer being upgraded or supported.*

*Along with 14 other South Central Kansas libraries, Whitewater Memorial Library will upgrade to a new web-based computer system called Polaris on **November 18, 2010.***

One of the benefits of this will be the creation of a library website at www.whitewaterlib.info.

Patrons can access the website on the Internet from any

computer and find information on upcoming library events, etc.

Patrons will also be able to see the library's collection of materials on the website and know with just a click whether that item is available. Patrons will also be able to place a hold on items they want to come to the library to check out.

Library cards and key tags will be offered to all patrons free of charge. (Replacement card fee is \$1.) Patrons may choose whether to accept their

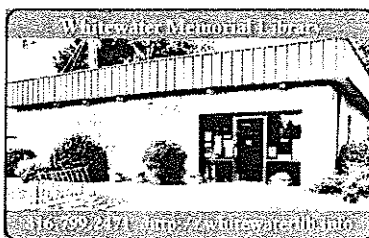
cards but those patrons wanting to use the online

services will need a library card.

Very soon library staff will begin updating patron information to make sure it is accurate. At that time, patrons will be asked whether they would like to receive "due soon" and overdue notices via email.

The "go live" date for the new system is set for Thursday, November 18. Library staff will attend Polaris training the three days prior on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, November 15, 16 and 17, 2010.

Small Business Spotlight

In 2006 the Kansas Legislature passed the Personal and Family Protection Act. This act permitted the legal carrying of a concealed handgun

for the purposes of self-protection and the protection of property and loved ones without fear of government retribution.

According to the Kansas Attorney General, in order to apply for a concealed weapon permit, a gun owner must pass an 8-hour class and receive a Certificate of Completion. Then the individual must complete an application and send it, the Certificate of Completion and the necessary fees and turn it in to the appropriate law enforcement agency to be processed. The State has 90 days to process the application and either issue a CCH permit or

deny it. This process is not funded with taxpayer money. The \$132 Concealed Carry Application fee covers the cost of administering the program.

Since July of 2006, over 29,000 Kansans have applied for concealed carry licenses. The first licenses were issued on January 3, 2007.

Elbing resident **LH Brunner**, a trained Concealed Carry instructor, offers these classes locally for \$75. As a federally licensed firearms dealer, he also facilitates the transfer of purchased firearms from the seller to the buyer for a fee of \$20.

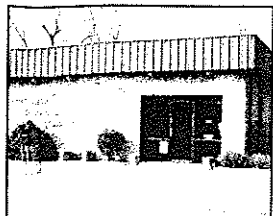
WHITEWATER RIVER CONSOLIDATED FIRE DISTRICT

The Fire Department responded to five calls for assistance during the month of October. Twelve volunteers gladly gave their time and skills to aid those needing help. It is a privilege to serve our community.

We have a unique opportunity recently to participate in a live structure fire training. A house in Elbing was made available to us some months ago for training specific to structure fires. Several different drills were held at the house. Training was done in search & rescue techniques, working in a smoke atmosphere, setting ladders, ventilation, forcible entry, and emergency exiting. On October 30, we were able to conduct several live fire evolutions in the house. This helps prepare us in observation of fire behavior, dealing with heat and smoke, and practicing the responsibilities of each member of the interior fire attack team. Although there are additional risks to this type of training, it is critical to proper preparation. Following the interior drills, we gain additional experience in exposure protection while we monitored the total burn of the house. Potwin Fire and Newton Fire cooperated with Whitewater Fire for this training experience.

Whitewater Community Newsletter December, 2010

WHITEWATER RIVER CONSOLIDATED FIRE DISTRICT

The City of Whitewater was declared to be a Third Class City of the State of Kansas in 1890. A volunteer fire department was initiated that same year. Main Street business proprietors were encouraged to maintain a tank or cistern for a ready water supply. The first fire apparatus was a hand pulled cart which contained an axe, a ladder, and a number of water buckets. The cart was kept in the livery barn which stood east of Ravenscraft Implement. The volunteers were notified of a fire when someone ran to the Lutheran Church building and rang the bell. This was a simple beginning but a grand commencement.

In 1999, the Whitewater Fire Department became the Whitewater River Consolidated Fire District. The City of Whitewater no longer owns equipment nor manages the budget. The City does own the fire station building and leases it to the District. The Fire District is supervised by an independent Board of Directors which represents each of four Townships and the cities of Elbing and Whitewater. The District provides fire protection and medical first response to 126 square miles.

As you would expect and want, many changes have taken place over the years. The goal of each change is improvement in fire protection, more safety for the firefighters, better medical and trauma response, and lower fire insurance rates. The Fire District is confident that these goals are being met.

Although absolutely necessary, modern equipment and buildings do not constitute a fire department. The Whitewater area is privileged to have a group of men and women who care enough to train and respond to the most dire needs of the community. The volunteers who make up the Fire Department consider it an honor to serve our neighbors in this capacity.

Council Meetings are held the 4th Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at the City Building and are open to the public.

Gene Stangohr was present to ask the council to consider selling property on North Main for the purpose of building a storage building.

After some discussion involving ATV's in the city, it was decided to contact the city attorney regarding writing an ordinance to allow ATV's with certain restrictions. Fines for failure to follow the restrictions will be included in this ordinance.

Five year goals were discussed next. The possibility of updating the playground equipment was presented. Grants will be looked into for this purpose. The possibility of having the recycling trailer an additional time during the month will also be asked about.

Boards for 2011 were approved as presented. One vacancy remains yet and will be filled as soon as possible.

The sealing of the streets was discussed.

Personnel reviews were conducted.

The city offices will be closed Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve for the holidays this year.

A donation request was discussed. A thank you from the Fall Festival Committee was read.

Various areas of concern were discussed. These will be looked into.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:40.
