The Animal Control Report, and Court Docket for December and Financial statement for November were presented.

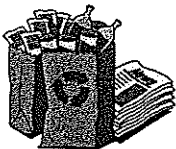
The Christmas lighting and other events of that day were also mentioned. A thank you will be placed in the newsletter.

JAIL

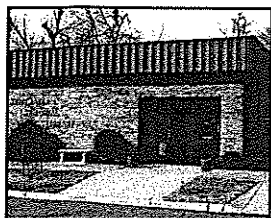
Restoration work on the jail continues. The rotten window frames have been replaced with new lumber and are nearly ready for the replacement windows.

The Year 2011 in Review - Briefly

At the close of business December 31, 2011, the library listed 542 registered patrons and contained 11,577 items.

Throughout the year 475 patrons checked out 20,081 items.

Children's activities were

attended by 465 children and 130 adults. Adult activity attendance numbered 179.

The end of 2011 also marked the completion of one full year with the web-based library system called Polaris. This sys-

tem allows patrons to view the library catalog online, reserve checked out items and access their account.

Two new material types were added to the collection: the Nook Simple Touch eReader and Playaway Views.

Main Street Gallery is continuing to collect photographs of historic Whitewater. Please don't be confused by the word "historic." We also need pictures from the 1980s and 1990s in order to maintain continuity in the history of our town. We are interested in photos showing Whitewater commerce, houses, and local community activity including town celebrations, school buildings and events, and church buildings and functions.

Any photographs can be donated or can be scanned and returned. All pictures already in the collection are available for viewing, reminiscing, or researching. Main Street Gallery has become Whitewater's historical center. Several local students have already discovered this resource for research and class projects. There is insufficient room to display many artifacts but numerous photos are displayed and many more can be viewed from the computer. New displays are rotated in as pictures are collected and grouped in order to tell a story or document a part of our history.

The story of Whitewater also includes references to surrounding towns. If you know of pictures of Brainerd, Annelly, Furley, Elbing, Potwin, or others, we would be interested in seeing those as well. Pictures of area rural schools and churches will also contribute to the history of Whitewater.

All are welcome to stop by to bring a picture, tell a story, or view the displays. The hours are variable due to my responsibilities but the building is usually open from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM. If you find the door locked, I apologize, but please come back. I don't want to miss you!

News from Central Kansas Community Foundation

(Newton, KS, January 9, 2012) – Central Kansas Community Foundation is pleased to welcome Angie Baur, as the latest member of their leadership team. Baur will serve as the Associate Director of Central Kansas Community Foundation, based in Newton, KS.

Baur joins Central Kansas Community Foundation under the leadership of Executive Director, Sandra Fruit. Fruit has served in this capacity since 2007 and has a career in non-profit management that includes serving as Vice President of Advancement for Prairie View, Inc. in Newton; a fundraising consultant with Betty Johnson & Associates in Manhattan, Kansas, and as associate director of gift planning for the Kansas State University Foundation. She also served as a founding board member and Executive Director of South Central Community Foundation and a founding board member of the Manhattan Community Foundation.

Fruit shared, "Angie comes to us from our affiliate community foundation in Butler County. She is a seasoned executive that will bring many talents to our growing organization. In fact, Angie has been in the not for profit sector for over 20 years and brings knowledge of the human service network as well as leadership skills. She was the executive for Orange County YMCA, Laguna Niguel; 2-1-1 Orange County; and the Mental Health Association, as well as a consultant for Public Square Communities and Core Essentials."

Fruit noted that the dramatic growth of CKCF in recent years, and the expansion of this network of foundations that now includes 12 affiliates, requires additional staff support and promotion. Baur will play a key role in affiliate relations while also leading the management of the region-wide scholarship cycle.

Central Kansas Community Foundation serves Harvey, Marion and Butler counties. Their asset base is more than \$11 million, with a goal to surpass 20 million by 2020. In 2011 260 grants totaling more than \$800,000 were distributed.

The broad community impact made possible by local donors is evident as these totals are considered. It is because of local donors the community foundation is able to provide grants and scholarships. 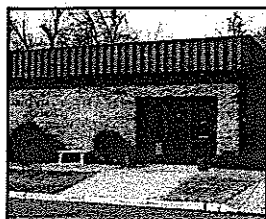

Win Hunger Games Movie Tickets

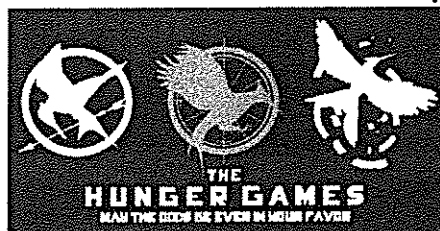
The Hunger Games Trilogy is a best-selling science fiction series written for young adults by Suzanne Collins.

The next meeting will be an exchange meeting with Lily Lake April 9th in Augusta.

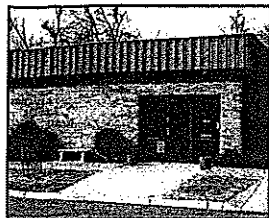

BUTLER COUNTY UPDATE

At the February Whitewater Chamber of Commerce meeting the question of why there were not signs at K-254 and Butler Road indicating Whitewater was 11 miles to the North was asked. The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) was contacted and they agreed to add the signage at the intersection. KDOT has ordered the signs and will install them in the near future.

The intersection of Butler Road and NW 30th was also discussed as the County will be raising the intersection and lowering the approaching roads for good sight distance from all directions. This project is being done for safety reasons and 90% of construction costs will be from Federal highway dollars. Presently the project is in the design stage and bids will go out to contractors later this year for construction to begin in the spring of 2013. It is anticipated that this project will take 3 months and will be completed in the summer of 2013. Unfortunately, Butler Road will have to be closed during construction. An exact detour route will be determined later but may possibly be west on NW 10th to Greenwich, north to 40th and east back to Butler Road. More information will be available as we approach actual construction.

Repair to NW River Valley and NW Diamond Roads has been started. During the summer of 2010 TransCanada Keystone Pipeline constructed a 36" crude oil pipeline through Butler County. Considerable damage was done to approximately 21 miles of NW River Valley and Diamond Roads between K-254 and the North Butler County line. On Tuesday April 3, 2012 the Butler County Commission approved a settlement agreement with Keystone Pipeline to repair the 21 miles of road damaged during construction. Keystone has agreed to pay Butler County \$1,800,000.00 to cover the cost of performing road repair work plus \$30,000.00 to pay for the cost of assessing the road damage. As many of you may know Butler County crews have already begun work on areas that were severely damaged. This preliminary work to repair the road base for the 21 miles will continue over the summer. Once permanent repairs to the base are completed the entire length of the road will be chip sealed. Both River Valley and Diamond roads will remain open during these repairs but traffic flow will be slow. We apologize for the inconvenience and ask for your patience as we restore these roads.

Whitewater Community Newsletter July, 2012

A gas-guzzling 1964 old Chevy dump truck was the start of a dream coming true for businessman Jerrold Unruh, who was born and raised in this area. Wanting a trucking job that allowed him to be home every night, he started hauling rock and sand for townships in 1978. The amount of fuel the truck used caused him to quit for a few months, and later in the year he started again. He then hauled concrete sand and rock for Kelley Concrete out of Newton, as well as hauling for the townships. Basement contractors in the Newton area also called on him for fill sand. This one-truck operation has grown into J.L. Unruh, L.L.C. and is now in its 34th year of business.

In 1980 Jerrold married a girl from Greensburg, Kansas and rented a house not far from his parents' house east of Elbing. The dispatching and office work were all done out of the home for 18 years till 1991 when a shop with an office was built a half-mile away. At that time a mechanic for their trucks was hired, and the company also branched out into doing mechanic work for others. The couple's three daughters have all taken their turn working in the office when they were teenagers.

The business has grown till there are now approximately four shop employees, two office employees, 10 trucks owned by the company with hired drivers, as well as 7 lease owner-operator truck drivers. The company is also affiliated with Florence Rock Company and Bentley Sand Company.

The company hauls for farmers and individuals, railroads, townships, building contractors, and the state of Kansas; hauling mainly rock, sand, dirt, boulders, salt, lime, grain, fertilizer, and wet distiller's grain. The drivers are trained to spread rock and sand onto driveways and roads. There are stockpiles of sand, rock, dirt, and railroad ties at the yard, available for purchase.

They are located at 12475 NW 160th St. (From Whitewater go north to 150th St. [better known as 1st St.], then 2 miles east, 1 mile north on Meadowlark Avenue, and 1½ miles east on the gravel road). 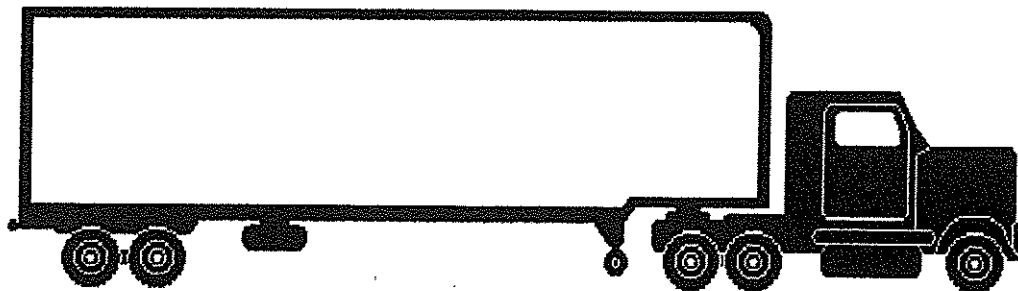
Janzen Trucking, Inc. of Elbing has been in business since 1987 when Bruce Janzen purchased the business of Whitewater trucker Gerald Abrahams, whom with his father had operated it for many years prior. After a year or two of developing the customer base, the business grew to having 4 trucks and drivers working full time hauling agricultural products from the NW area of Butler County to various locations both in Kansas and regionally. This area of area Kansas was ripe with opportunities for hauling farm products and several other trucking companies along with Janzen Trucking grew during this time period.

One of the constant realities of life is change and the trucking industry wasn't immune to it either. Rules changes from the State and Federal regulators allowed farmers to purchase larger trucks and soon there was competition from not only others in the business but from some of the people that I had been hauling for in the past. Also the way that livestock and grain were marketed changed and many of these changes didn't favor the independent truckers. At the same time I realized that finding a niche market seemed to be an answer to some of these changes so I began to emphasize on hauling pigs, since many livestock haulers would rather not haul the "short legged charolais", a slang term for hogs. Because of this change in operations and other external factors my percentage of cattle hauling reduced. Further changes occurred when the closest meat packer, Tyson Foods, closed its slaughter operations in Emporia, Ks. Now the thousands of cattle grown in this area needed to go to western Kansas for processing. Many of the packers in that area have their own "in house" trucking companies so the number of cattle available for hauling dropped drastically.

The dry conditions of the past two years have also reduced the volume of grain grown in this area and have made feeding livestock more challenging. These economic issues trickle down and have the potential to hurt the businesses that rely on agriculture for their livelihood. I haven't been immune to these realities and so I have branched into other areas such as refrigerated hauling to augment my local trucking.

Hopefully this drought will end soon and the productivity of this area will return to more normal levels.

Memorial Funds New Desk

Friends of Rose Breitenstein may remember her as a talented quilter and avid reader with a no-nonsense attitude. There was much more to Rose than that, of course. Her friends and family showed that with their generous gifts to the library in memory of Rose.

Those gifts were used to commission John Claassen to build a new library circulation desk. Built of oak with a cherry stain, it is topped with a blue-gray countertop.

The extended design allows for more storage



and work area for library staff and two display areas on the corners. The accompanying work station is scheduled to arrive within the next week or so.

The wood pattern on the center front panel is made of four different woods in a quilt pattern called 8 Point Star. Upon close inspection, the placement of the eight points mimics the look of four open books.

Rose's memorial plaque is mounted just above the quilt pattern.

The American Legion Auxiliary Unit #65 of Whitewater recently placed two books in the library in memory of two of their members.

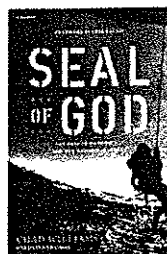
Into the Fire by Dakota Meyer & Bing West was given in memory **Lorraine Swart**.
