The Lamb Funeral Home at 120 South Main has been a mortuary and in continuous service Since 1893. Over the years the firm has been known by many names, Francis Furniture and Undertaking, Frank Bishop Furniture and Undertaking, Smith Mortuary and since 1958 the Lamb Funeral Home.

Bob and Mae Lamb purchased the funeral home from the estate of Harold Smith in December of 1958. The Lambs operated the funeral home and furniture store and the ambulance. In the early 1960's the furniture store and ambulance were discontinued but the Lambs continued to serve the community with funeral service. In 2004 Ty Zeiner of Marion purchased the funeral business from the Lambs and Bob and Mae continued to assist with the funeral business as long as their health allowed. Bob's sister Helen Kiser also helped at the funeral home. Currently the funeral home is operated by Ty Zeiner in the capacity of funeral director and embalmer and Amy White as funeral director and Roy Brockmeier as part time funeral director.

Dave reported that the new tires approved in November had been installed.

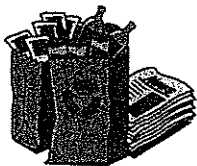
The animal control report for December was presented.

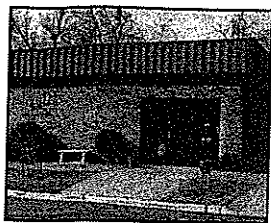

Experience WW II from a Different Angle

Much has been written about World War II, but not often do we hear of the immeasurable suffering of the Germans who wanted no part of Hitler's regime.

Abandoned and Forgotten by Evelyne Tannehill is the memoir of a young girl growing up in the then-German province of East Prussia by the Baltic Sea.

Orphaned at the age of nine and left to fend for herself in a hostile world, Evelyne Tannehill witnessed firsthand what happens when law and order break down and self-preservation becomes the only thing that matters.

Her journey is a poignant example of how

resilient the human spirit can be, even in the face of war's greatest horrors.

An excerpt: "I was so scared, I couldn't move. I thought the tank would roll right over me. But it stopped. A soldier jumped down and picked me up. I was terrified. When we arrived at a village, that same soldier carried me to the first farm house we came to. He pointed his pistol at the women and children who lived there and said, 'You! Take care of girl! Her people dead. Germanski Soldat, German soldiers, kill.' You should have seen the

women. They looked like stone statues, afraid to breathe. The soldier set me down and handed me a piece of choco-

late. Then, he climbed back into the tank, and they drove off."

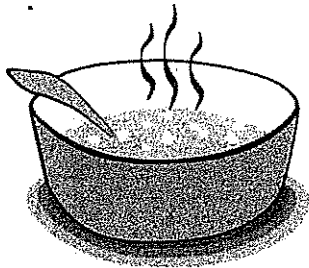

Frederic Remington Historical Society Meeting

Monday, February 4, 2013, 7:30 P.M. Remington High School
Recalling the Seagoing Cowboys of 1945-1947"

The program will begin with a 20 minute DVD preview prepared by Peggy Miller, Seagoing Cowboys historian. Three local seagoing cowboys will then tell stories of their trips: Edwin Andres, Elbing; Pete Z. Friesen, Newton; and Nick Toews, Whitewater.

Between the summers of 1945 and 1947, over 7,000 men and boys volunteered to serve as "seagoing cowboys." They delivered livestock to war-torn countries through a partnership of two agencies: The United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration (UNRRA) and the Brethren Service Committee of the Church of the Brethren (BSC). The horses, cattle, and mules the cowboys tended in transit helped countries in Europe and Asia rebuild after the war.

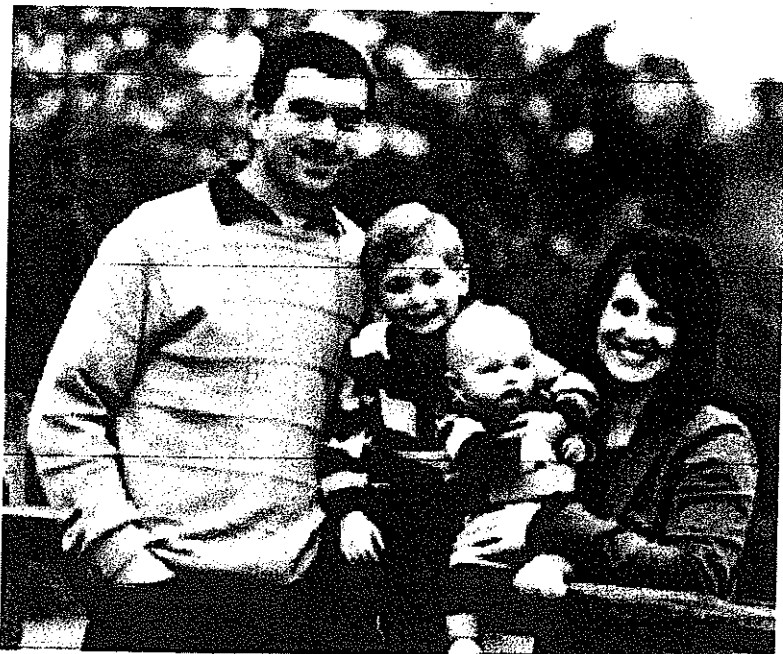

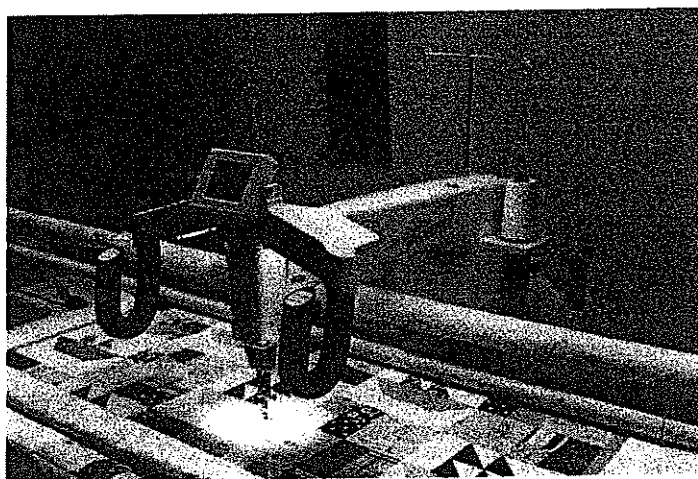

Custom..... 0.03 cents per sq. in.

Machine Binding:

*Half (I sew binding on top of quilt for you to finish).....: 0.15 cents per inch

*Whole.....0.18 cents per inch

Hand Binding.....0.30 cents per inch

I charge \$40 minimum for any quilt top. If I need to do any pressing that will cost an additional \$10. I can provide batting at my cost. I also charge \$2 per quilt for white/cream thread or can provide thread of your choice at cost.

Backing fabric must be an extra 4 inches larger than the quilt on all four sides. Please make sure there are no loose threads.

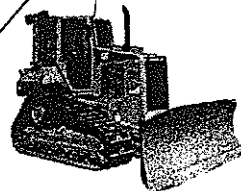

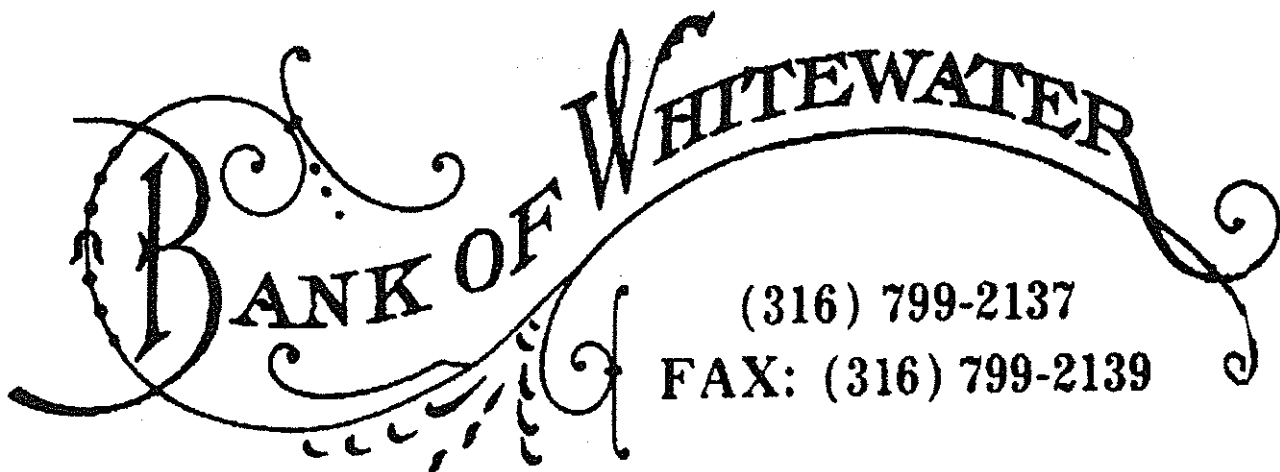

WHITEWATER RIVER CONSOLIDATED FIRE DISTRICT

Eight calls were made in January for medical or fire assistance. Ten Volunteers were available for these calls. We experienced one house fire in January. We were able to stop the fire inside the house due to prompt reporting and excellent response time. There were no injuries and only a minimum amount of property damage. The Fire Departments of Newton, Potwin, and Walton also responded to assist with the fire.

The Whitewater River Fire District responded to a total of 146 calls in 2012. Of those, 94 calls were medical or rescue related. This is a few more calls than the previous two years but well below the record of 170 calls in 2006. We can all be proud to live in a community where neighbors are careful but also willing to take care of each other.

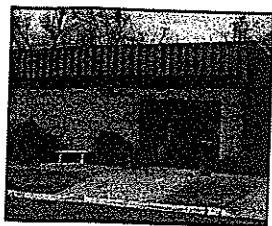

Other events included an exhibit of historic Whitewater clothing and an interactive Titanic exhibit, couponing class, book discussions, Story Time, Summer Reading Club, special speakers, Kids Pedal Tractor Pull and the annual FOL book sale.

A new circulation desk and workstation was built and installed by rural Whitewater resident John Claassen and funded by

the Rose Breitenstein memorial.

With the levied budget remaining the same as in 2009:

- ⇒ the library offered 51 programs for youth and adults with a total attendance of 1,609;
- ⇒ 89 new patrons registered
- ⇒ visits to the library increased from 9,396 to 9,762;
- ⇒ circulation of children's items showed an increase of 2,368 while 781 more adult items were checked out than in 2011.

Payless ShoeSource is sponsoring the writing contest for the second year. The contest is open to students in grades 3 - 12 in the state of Kansas.

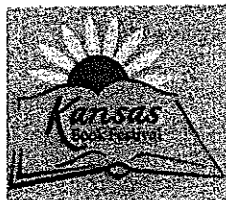
"It is our hope that this writing contest will

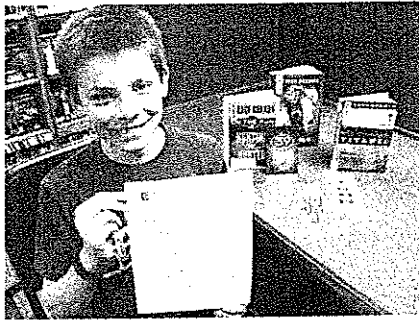
Author and Reader Share Love of Reading

Epp, a retired research scientist, has collected a lifetime's worth of poems written by his mother that tell of her Harder family and the community in which they lived.

The poems are interwoven with the history of West

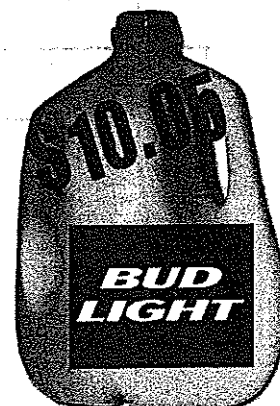
The Comparative Value of Water



The July 2012 issue of *The Kansas Lifeline* contains two articles related to the value of water: "Who Will Determine What's 'Affordable Water'" by Pat McCool; and Setting a "Proper Water Rate" by Carl Brown. Both articles are well written and stimulated me to assess how Douglas County Rural Water District No. 1's water rates compare with items that are purchased every day at the local Dillon's Grocery Store.

I recognize that the price for some of the commodities fluctuate due to sales, customer demands, other market factors, and that prices vary between stores/stations and public water supply systems. However, you might find the following comparisons of interest.

RWD #1 Retail Water	\$7.40/1,000 gallons (1 gallon = 128 oz. or \$.0074, taxes included)
Gasoline	\$3,800/1,000 gallons (\$3.80 per gallon, taxes included)
Dillons Milk	\$2,990/1,000 gallons (\$2.99 per gallon)
Pepsi	\$4,580/1,000 (12 pack = 144 oz. @ \$5.15 or \$4.58/gallon)
Minute Maid Orange Juice	\$6,400/1,000 (119 oz. @ \$5.98 or \$6.40/gallon)
Dasani Bottled Water	\$4,850/1,000 (6 pack = 102 oz. @ \$3.85 or \$4.85/gallon)
Bud Light	\$10,050/1,000 (12 pack = 144 oz. @ \$11.29 or \$10.05/gallon)



While Douglas RWD No. 1 and the gasoline station include taxes (or fees) in the total cost of the product, soft drinks, orange juice, bottled water, and beer prices listed above do not include taxes – thus making the difference between those products and public water supplies even wider.

Safe, available, public water is a bargain beverage – and can cost-effectively be used to water the gardens, wash the car, make ice cubes and provide showers, and for a multitude of additional purposes.

While recognizing that consumers do not want to pay higher prices for any commodity, rural water districts and municipalities need to do a better job of promoting the value

of their product, water. As local water suppliers and the State of Kansas look to the future, water availability and water quality will increasingly become topics of discussion.

Water quality problems in public water supply lakes, reservoirs, and rivers include: sediment, nutrient loads, blue-green algae, and other problems that close state lakes, pose health risks, affect taste and odor, and increase water treatment costs.

As public water supply systems and the State discuss water treatment, drought/flood protection, supply availability, and other issues related to water quality and quantity, we collectively must plan for the future to ensure adequate safe drinking water. Investments to protect our long-term water supplies – even if we doubled the cost per 1,000 gallons – will continue to leave water as the least expensive commodity per gallon consumed.

At July 20, 2012 prices, Douglas County Rural Water District No. 1 patrons receive 1,000 gallons of water for \$7.40. I know many systems have rates far less than our district has. But, for that same \$7.40, our water district patrons would receive: 2.20 gallons of gasoline, 2.47 gallons of milk, 1.62 gallons of soft drink, 1.16 gallons of orange juice, 1.53 gallons of bottled water, or .74 gallons of beer.

If the price of water to our customers doubled to \$14.40 per 1,000 gallons to help pay for State investments in protecting surface water supplies, our customers would still only be able to purchase 3.79 gallons of gasoline, 4.94 gallons of milk, 3.24 gallons of soft drink, 2.32 gallons of orange juice, 3.06 gallons of bottled water, or 1.48 gallons of beer for the same amount of money.

As we discuss water rates and investments needed to safeguard our water supplies, it is important to keep in mind the value that public water systems provide to their customers. While we may not want to pay more to water our gardens, lawn, livestock, or to shower, make ice cubes, or drink, the absence of quality water in sufficient amounts to meet the public's needs has much higher costs. We cannot cost-effectively substitute any of the other products for the public water supplies that rural water districts and municipalities provide every day.

Officer Baker stated that he is working to get a traffic trailer for use here in town to check vehicles speeds in the City limits.

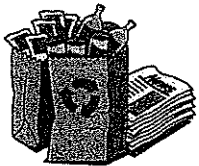

Local Author To Speak About Recently Published Book



Rural Whitewater resident Melvin Epp will share about his book, *Petals of a Kansas Sunflower: A Mennonite Diaspora*, at the library on **Sunday, April 21, at 2:00 pm.**

"This anthology of my mother's poetry was published in December. Marie Harder Epp was a village poet and for 60 years contributed uniquely personalized poetry for relatives and friends to enhance celebrations within her community. The 105 poems are embedded in historical narrative to enlarge the understanding of her poetic statements. Because she wrote between 1929 and 1991, she recorded the twentieth century. Her poetry also traces the history of our ancestors immigrating

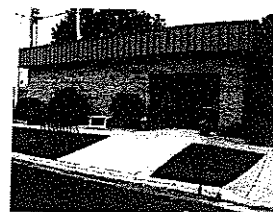
to Kansas in 1876 and initiating a worship center in the first building completed among the tall grasses—the granary on the Bernhard Harder Sr. farm, forming the nucleus of the Emmaus Mennonite Church. The poems record the history of the community as people were born, married, died, and tamed the prairies with church, cemeteries, schools, and prosperous farms, which had hand-dug wells, and were accessible to markets with railroad services. Marie created a female perspective of history with her poems.

To develop an understanding of what it meant personally for my ancestors to follow Anabaptist teachings, I have attached two appendices in which I trace the impact of being Anabaptist from the

Reformation through Holland to Prussia and West Prussia, and continuing to the time they got on the *SS Rhein* at the New Harbor in Bremerhaven. In a third appendix, I have detailed the tornado of June 8, 1941 to put a historical perspective on that tragic event, which ripped through the very heart of the community a year before I was born, but served as a reference point in time for my family. The farm created by my great-grandfather was demolished.

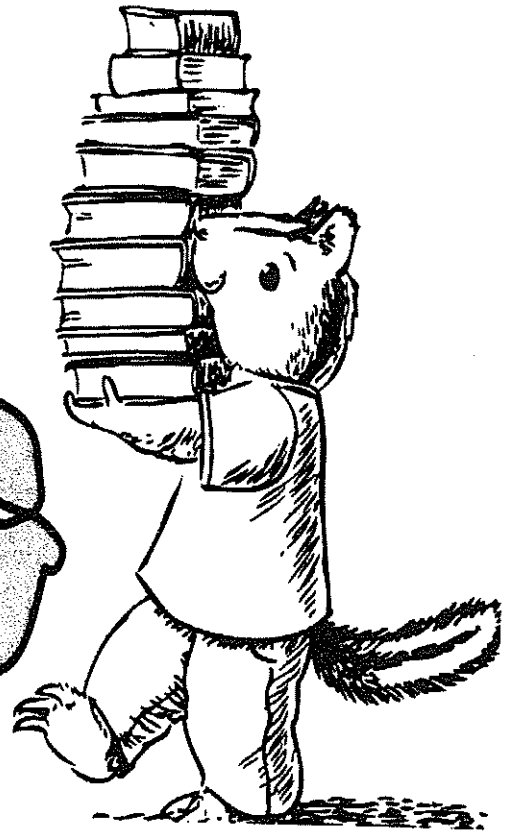

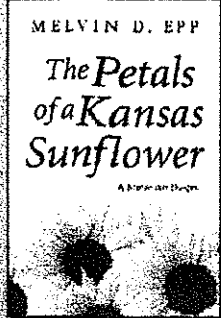

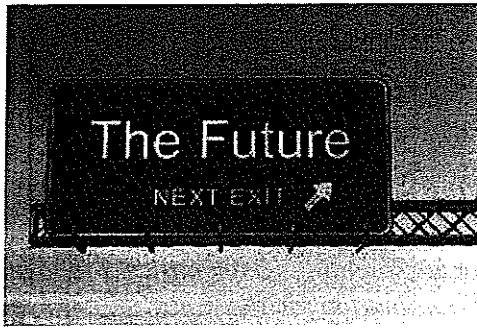

The future is now!

Wheat State Manor's strategic plan includes expanding its services by building a new facility. It will be located behind our current facility and designed to house up to twenty residents who need support, but who do not need the level of care provided in a nursing home. We will also be converting the exiting building to an "all private room" facility.

As a part of this activity we are making application with the Kansas Department of Commerce to participate in the Community Service Tax Credit program. If we are successful in our application this means that donations received to support the *Wheat State Manor Facility Addition Campaign* will be eligible to **receive a 70% tax credit for contributions!**

A tax credit is different than a tax deduction. It is a credit that applies to your State Tax Liability. You do not have to itemize your taxes to benefit. Donations must be in the amount of \$250 or greater—but you receive a full 70% of your donation back. **Even if you do not owe state taxes you will receive a refund of \$175 for every \$250 you donate.**

Main, Whitewater, KS 67154 no later than Thursday, April 25.** Just share what Wheat State Manor means to you and your loved ones, express your support for the *Wheat State Manor Facility Addition Campaign*, indicate your pledge amount (a dollar amount is not required at this time, but would be greatly appreciated), and express an urgency (why we need to do this now!).

We are requesting \$250,000 in tax credits for this campaign. If our application is approved we will be authorized to offer tax credits between the eighteen (18) month period of July 1, 2013 to December 31, 2014. Contributions can be received no sooner than July 1, 2013. The contributions to this campaign will be used to purchase furniture, fixtures, and equipment for the new facility.



We are not asking for donations at this time — we are asking for pledge letters of support! The application process is highly competitive and we need your support. The impact Wheat State Manor has had on our community, since being built in 1974, is hard to define. 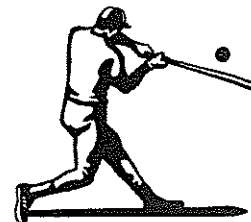
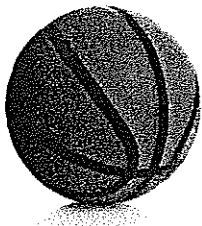
Memory Screenings—Who Should be Screened?

Obituary

Shirley Ann Smith, a model, actress and artist in both the Big Apple and the Little Apple, died Oct 10th in New York City at the age of 84.

A graveside memorial service will be at 2pm on Friday 20th December at the Whitewater Cemetery.

Shirley Ann Smith was born in 1929 in Whitewater. The daughter of Harold and Blanche Smith, she was involved in community and school theatrical productions, and these skills, combined with her auburn hair and appealing freshness earned her the title of Miss Butler County in 1947.

She majored in radio at Kansas State University, Manhattan, Ks, was in several productions of the K-State Players and was involved with the campus radio station. Representing her sorority, Alpha Delta Pi, she was crowned Miss Manhattan in 1949 and, thus, an American Royal Princess in Kansas City.

Upon graduation in 1951, she moved to Kansas City where she worked at KCMO Radio. Walking on the Country Club Plaza there, she was spotted by a photographer, and, as a result, she appeared on billboards and newspaper advertisements for Helzberg's, Kansas City's major jewelry store. At that time, Shirley also appeared in independent films by an aspiring local film maker, Robert Altman.

After a year in Kansas City, Shirley moved to New York City where she was signed up by the Huntington Hartford modeling agency. Featured in Vogue, Mademoiselle and Harper's, she appeared in three of the first ten national magazine ads for Maidenform. Those advertisements earned a place at the Smithsonian as "Classic Americana".

With the money she was making from modeling, Shirley was taking acting classes. Among her unknown classmates were Paul Newman and Joanne Woodward. Shirley was chosen for the replacement cast in a new Broadway show, "Picnic" by native Kansan William Inge. She also starred in the show's first touring show. She was in other Broadway shows, one with Robert Redford and one with Tallulah Bankhead. She appeared in a film with Peter Falk and had the lead in an Alfred Hitchcock TV show.

In between acting jobs, she took up painting. She studied at the Art Students League with Helen Frankenthaler and at an art colony in Provincetown, and these classes led to her painting full-time. As part of a new movement called "Lyrical Abstraction," Shirley had two paintings on exhibition at the Whitney Museum of American Art in New York City.

In the 1970s, Shirley bought part of an abandoned doll factory and became one of the first NYC artists to move into a SoHo loft. She continued in the abstract style but came to incorporate the pigs, cows, turkeys and other animals with which she'd grown up with in Kansas. In her later years, she also embraced video and digital art. In 1991, she was honored by The American Academy of Arts and Letters.

In 1999, Shirley had a major retrospective exhibition at the new Beach Museum of Art at Kansas State University, Manhattan, Kansas. In accordance with her wishes, many of her artworks will become part of the permanent collection at the Beach Museum.

Shirley Smith was preceded in death by her parents, Harold and Blanche (Alexander) Smith and her brothers Roderick and Gene Smith. She is survived by her nephew, Scott Smith, Shoreham-by-Sea, England.
