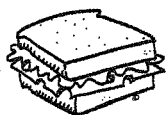

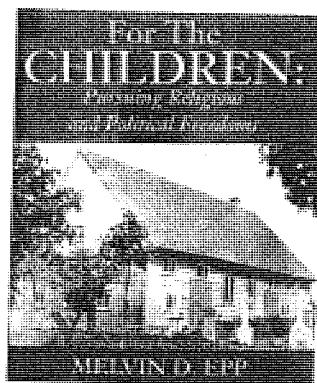
Local Author Dr. Melvin D. Epp Publishes New Book

Local author, Dr. Melvin D. Epp has just published the book, ***For the Children: Pursuing Religious and Political Freedom: the Remarkable Life Journeys of Peter Epp and His Children Agnetha and Johann.***

Together with input from cousins, Gladys Wiebe, Daryl Regier, Joyce Keys, Agnes Harder, and Linda Baumann, we have completed the genealogical story of the Emmaus Mennonite Church Epp family.

The book begins with a short succinct "capsule" of Mennonite history - as one reader described it, and then the historical origins of the family names: Epp, Andres, Harder, and Regier.

The storyline begins in 1825 with Peter Epp who married Agnetha Andres. They had two surviving children: Agnetha (Epp) Thiessen - the grandmother of all Thiessens at Emmaus, and Johann Epp (later John Epp, Sr.) - the

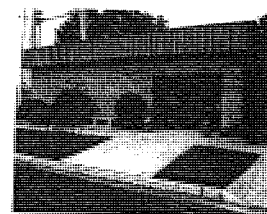


grandfather of all the original Epps at Emmaus.

The diaspora that Peter and Agnetha followed just for the benefit of their children - "their gift from God," from West Prussia to southern Russia to Beatrice,

NE to Brainerd, KS is outlined and detailed. The sad stories of fires, childhood maladies, health issues without modern medicine, and death, all are part of these life journeys. The book has 56 remarkable figures and ends with a summary showing that by the end of 2014, Johann's more than 700 descendants are recipients of the religious and political freedoms that Peter and Agnetha desired for their children 150 years ago.

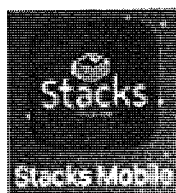
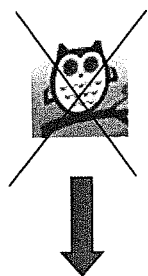

If your mobile device is set to automatically update apps, the OWL

For first-time users, the library's mobile app allows users to check the library catalog and manage their library account.

6,000 miles to reach her Kansas home with the Bill and Jayne Carey family of rural Whitewater.

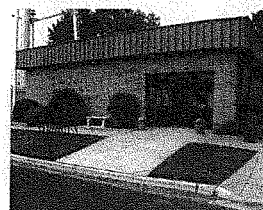


Her Ukrainian family includes a five year old sister, Margo, who is counting the days until her big sister comes home in June.

Frederic Remington Historical Society Meeting

Monday, March 7, 2016

**"Kansas BC." Dr. Donald J. Blakeslee,
Professor of Anthropology, Wichita State University, Wichita.**

This presentation looks at Kansas in the era before Columbus. Consider what was not here: no cities, no roads, no mechanization, and no domestic animals other than the dog. It is easy to imagine that the small human communities that occupied Kansas for thousands of years would have existed in relative isolation, focused on hand-to-mouth existence—but nothing could be further from the truth. The prehistoric inhabitants of Kansas traveled widely, even to central Mexico; traded with the Pueblo people of the Southwest; and included people interested in such arcane subjects as meteors and meteorites and were part of a continent-wide intellectual tradition. Dr. Blakeslee invites attendees to bring archaeological and ethnohistorical objects for identification or discussion after the lecture.

Questions regarding the City Code regarding the building of houses in Whitewater were asked and answered.

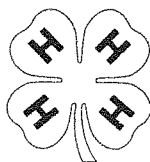
4th of July fireworks were discussed. A reminder will be placed in the city newsletter to remind people of dates and times that fireworks may be set off.

Animal Control report as well as Court Docket for March were presented. A reminder about the Whitewater Kansas Animal Control page will be placed in the April newsletter.

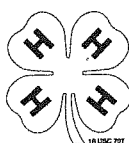
Expenditures for March were presented and approved.

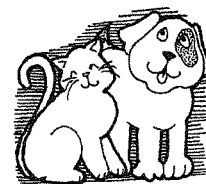

ANIMAL CONTROL INFORMATION

Tagging

Registration and vaccination required. Every owner of any dog or cat three months old shall annually register with the City Clerk his or her name and address with the name, sex and description of each dog or cat owned and kept within the city. It shall be unlawful for the owner of any newly acquired dog or cat or any dog or cat brought into the city to fail to register such animal within 30 days from acquisition or bringing the dog or cat into the city. It shall be unlawful for the owner of any previously registered cat or dog to fail to maintain current registration of such dog or cat.

Upon registration the owner shall present a current, completed certificate of immunization against rabies. No registration issued without evidence of this, and it is unlawful for the owner of any dog or cat over six months of age to fail to maintain effective rabies immunization.

The owner or harbinger of any dog shall, at the time of registering such dog or cat, present to the city clerk a certificate from an accredited veterinarian show that a male cat or dog has been neutered or a female dog or cat has been spayed, if the animal has been neutered or spayed.

It is requested that a picture of each pet be brought in when getting tags. This picture will be kept on file to help in identification.

The city clerk shall collect an annual registration fee of \$5.00 for each neutered male & for each spayed female dog or cat, & \$10.00 for each unneutered male and for each unspayed female dog or cat. The registration year shall be from June 1st through May 31st of the following year. This tag must be attached to the dog's collar. A duplicate tag will be issued for \$1.00 if lost.

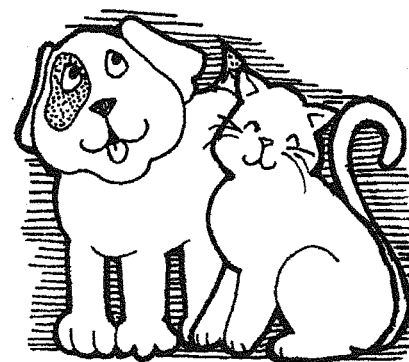
Impounding

If an animal is impounded and the owner is not known a description of the animal, date and place taken into custody and the contract phone number will be posted. The animal will be held for three business days from the date of the posting then the animal can be disposed as provided by in the city code. Any person who has an animal impounded would be required to get a city tag and pay boarding costs before being able to pick up their animal.

Microchipping

The city now has two readers for microchips. The animal control officer, Jimmy Ellis, has one and the other one is at the city building. If you find a stray animal please feel free to bring it and we can check to see if it has been chipped. You are also welcome to take it to Country Aid Vet Service for them to read it. Microchipping can be done at Country Aid Vet Service for \$43.00 plus an \$18.00 office call. If you bring in more than one animal at a time for chipping the office call would just be on the first animal. This is a great way to make sure your pet can be brought back home.

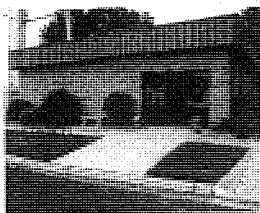

Waste Connections requests all items to be collected be set at the curb
prior to 7:30am, April 23rd

Waste Connections asks that all items being collected need to be able to be handled by two people safely. General trash, small amounts of bundled brush or limbs, Furniture including, chairs, couches, tables. Appliances including, washers, dryers, dishwashers, microwaves small electrical appliances such as TV's, computers, mixers, blenders. Patio grills, patio furniture, push lawn mowers (free of gas & oil) and lawn trimmers. Tree limbs and branches must be cut in 3ft. lengths and bundled for easy pickup. Any trash not in the trash cart must be in throwaway containers such as boxes or bags, no more than 30-gallon capacity. No loose trash or debris or no box or bag may exceed 40 pounds in weight.

Here is a list of items NO LANDFILL OR TRANSFER STATION will accept:

Car batteries, oil filters, fluorescent light bulbs, propane tanks, any asbestos materials, explosives, paint (we will take empty & dried up paint cans), no hazardous liquids (such as fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, solvents, diesel fuel, gas, oil, transmission fluid, antifreeze, etc...) tires. REFRIGERATORS, FREEZERS AND AIR CONDITIONS must be tagged by a technician and must have the appropriate paper work with it in order for Waste Connections to pick it up.

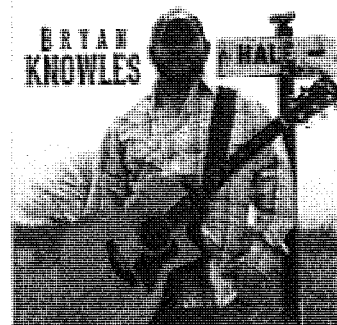
According to cdbaby.com, it is "a mix of Rock and Country and 100% original music straight from Southeast Kansas. Blazing acoustic

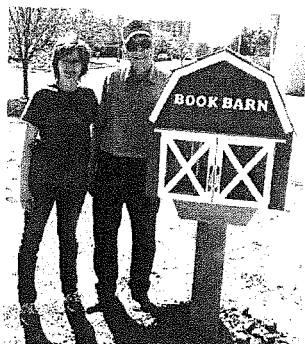

Kris Janzen.

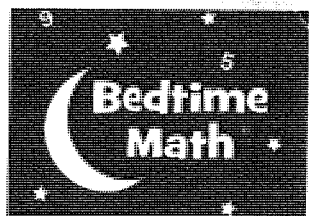

There being no further business council was adjourned.

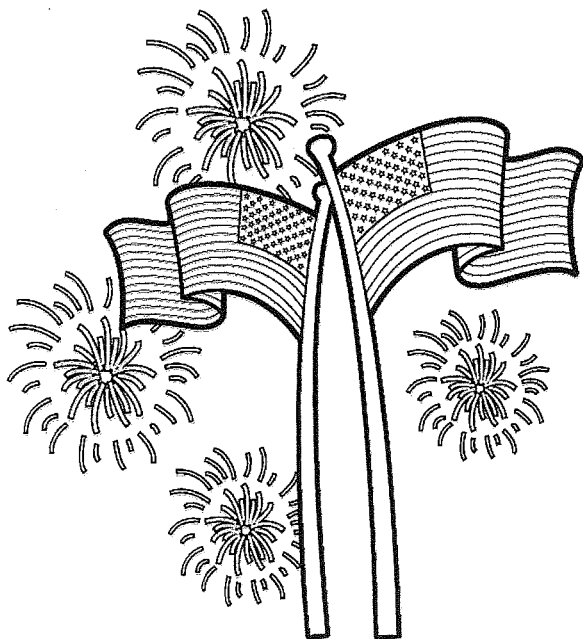

Don Engels filed on Wednesday, June 1, to run again for Butler County Clerk. He is approaching the end of his first term as county clerk. Engels said experience and good judgement will be needed in coming years because several significant changes are in store for the Clerk's office.

First, the schedule for city/school elections will change in 2017 from spring (April) to fall (November). If necessary, an odd-year primary will be in August. State legislators made this change with the hope that it will increase voter turnout. The Clerk's office is available to help all cities and schools adjust their schedules to match the new law. We expect to make this transition as smooth as possible to cities, schools, and voters.

Next, the county and any city that raises taxes above an established index must ask permission from voters. Should this happen, a mail ballot election will occur during late summer.

Finally, election administrators are being pressured to purchase and implement new voting equipment. Sedgwick County has committed to do this during 2017 and Butler County plans to follow in 2019.

Deputy Clerk Tatum Stafford will be the treasurer for Engels' campaign. Stafford has been the deputy clerk for the last two years and has been in charge of elections for 3 ½ years.

ORDINANCE ALLOWING CHICKENS IN WHITEWATER

Below are the steps to legally keep chickens in the city limits.

ORDINANCE NO. 599

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER II, ARTICLE I, BY ADDING NEW SECTION 109A OF THE CODE FOR THE CITY OF WHITEWATER, KANSAS, AS ADOPTED BY ORDINANCE NO. 438 OF THE SAID CITY, ESTABLISHING CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH CHICKENS MAY BE POSSESSED OR MAINTAINED WITHIN THE CITY AND REPEALING ANY SECTION OR PORTION OF THE CITY ORDINANCES THAT ARE INCONSISTENT HEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF WHITEWATER, KANSAS:

SECTION I. New Section 109A. Chapter II, Article I, of the Code of the City of Whitewater, Kansas, as adopted by Ordinance No. 438 of said City is hereby amended to add the following New Section:

New Section 109A

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to keep or harbor for any purpose chickens except under the conditions set forth below.
- (b) Up to 6 laying hens may be kept on any one residential lot or tract (this restriction applies even though a residence may include more than one lot) by permit only.
- (c) A \$20 annual permit fees shall be charged for each residential lot or tract owner. A permit form shall be obtain from the city clerk before a permit is issued. The Animal Control Officer shall inspect the appropriateness of the coops and compliance with other requirements set forth herein..
- (d) Roosters are not permitted. Laying hens only are allowed.
- (e) Chicken coops are required and structures housing chickens must be located at least 50 feet away from any structure that includes a dwelling unit on an adjacent lot.

SECTION II. Repeal. Any section or portion of the ordinances of the City of Whitewater, Kansas that are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

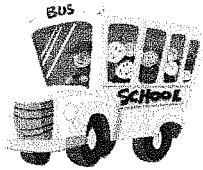
SECTION III. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption and publication in *The Butler County Times Gazette*, the official newspaper of said City.

PASSED AND ADOPTED THIS 27th day of June, 2016.

October 3, 2016 "The Story of Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) Meat Canning Programs" Jason Unruh, Peabody. Whitewater Fall Festival, joint meeting with Friends of the Whitewater Memorial Library, at **Centre Point Church, 212 S Main Street, Whitewater, 7:00 p.m.**

Locally, meat canning for relief began in the 1940s to aid in the relief effort of war torn countries of Europe. Many local people had relatives involved in postwar trauma. Jason Unruh served a two-year term traveling with the MCC Mobile Cannery. He is a Kansas State graduate and now farms near Peabody.

November 7, 2016 "Remembering the Tornado of June 8, 1941" Melvin D. Epp, Ph.D., FRAHS President. **Meeting at the Remington High School at 7:00 p.m.**

In this 75th anniversary year, Melvin Epp will review the history of the 1941 tornado. The only write-up available of this disaster is Appendix III in *Petals of a Kansas Sunflower* authored by the presenter. The presentation will also include testimonies or stories of people who were directly impacted by this storm.

February 6, 2017 "The Tragic Story of Catlin" Brian Stucky, retired art teacher of Goessel High School, and Leader of Friends of the Cherokee Trail—Kansas. **Meeting at the Remington High School at 7:00 p.m.**

Brian Stucky will recount the story of up to 17 Swiss Volhynian Mennonite children who died and were buried near Peabody during the 1874 migration from Russia. It was part of the price they paid for seeking religious and political freedom in America.

March 6, 2017 "Goat Glands to Ranch Hands -- The KFDI Story" Orin Friesen, Cowboy singer at Prairie Rose Chuckwagon Supper, Benton. **Meeting at the Remington High School at 7:00 p.m.**

Orin Friesen will be sharing out of his book, "Goat Glands to Ranch Hands – The KFDI Story." It is the 90+ year history of the Wichita AM radio station that most people know as KFDI. Orin recently celebrated 50 years in broadcasting.

April 3, 2017 "Children of the Promised Land" Angela Bates, Executive Director of the Nicodemus Historical Society. Sponsored by Kansas Humanities Council. **Meeting at the Remington High School at 7:00 p.m.**

Nicodemus, a small unincorporated town in Graham County, Kansas, is the only remaining western town that was established by African Americans during the Reconstruction Period following the Civil War. The discussion will explore the stories of children conceived in slavery but born free.

May 1, 2017 40th Anniversary of the Frederic Remington Area Historical Society at d'Veer Family Center, 227 N. Main Ave., Elbing, Kansas. **Doors open at 6:30 p.m.**

Dan Ravenscraft asked about getting new lighting installed in the fire stations bays. Mayor Ryan stated that this was part of the plan in updating the lights.

A change to the trash pickup route to work better with the new one way street on South Locust was discussed. Waste Connections will be contacted and will be asked to start the route there.

There being no further business council was adjourned.

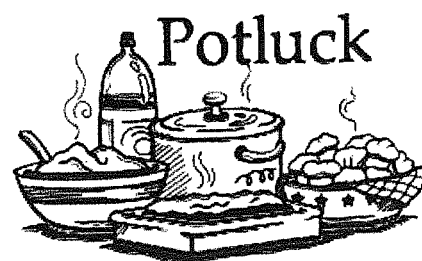

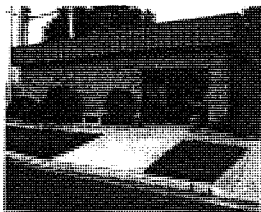

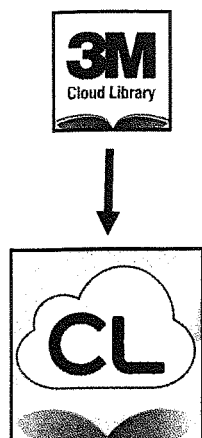

3M Cloud Library to Cloud Library.

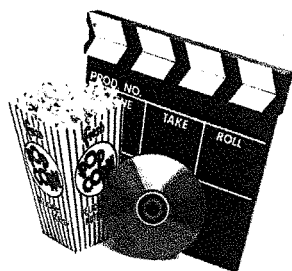
If the update hasn't happened automatically on your device, all Android, iOS and ChromeBooks users need to do is complete the update when prompted.

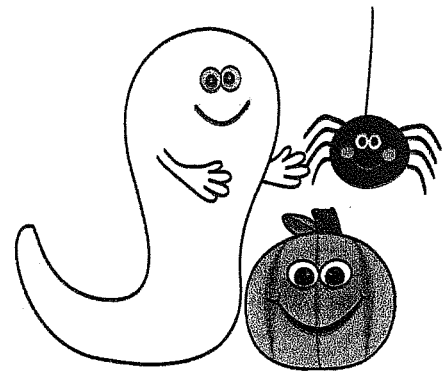

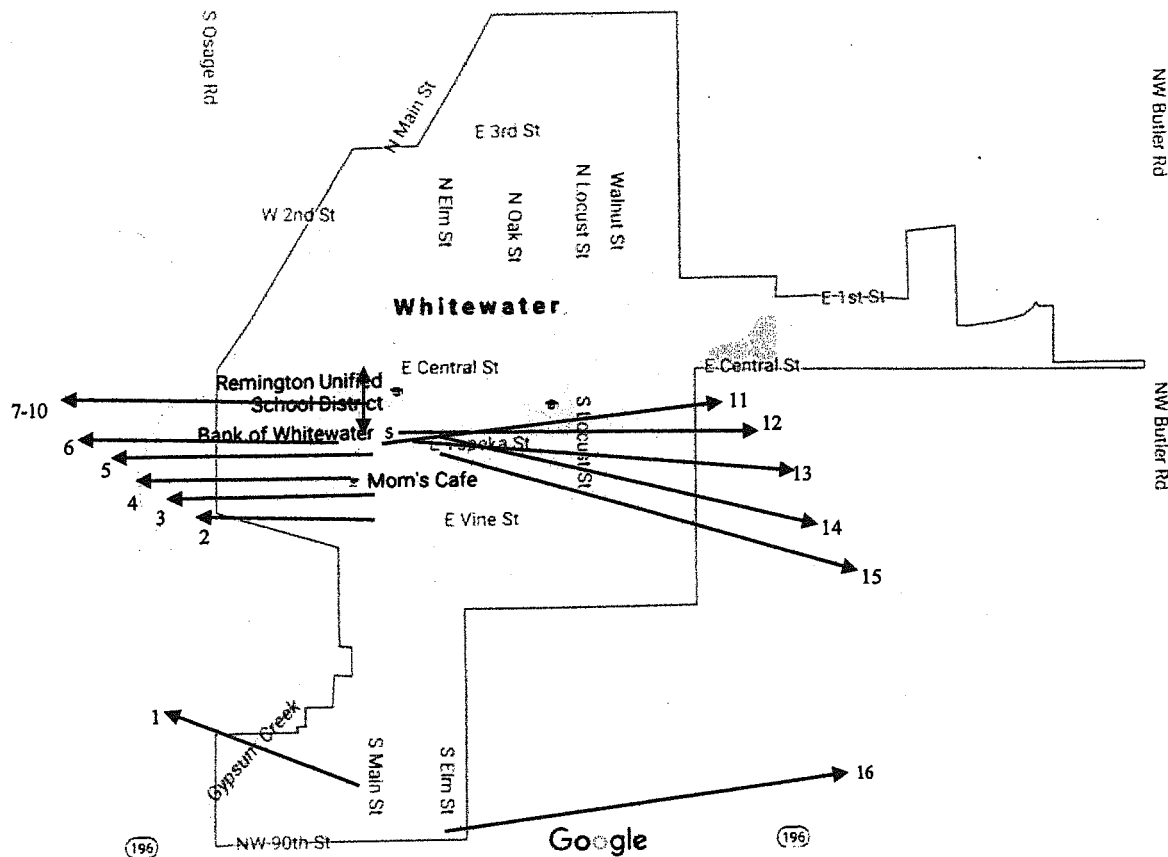

AS A REMINDER

Primary Citation: K. S. A. 21-6411-6418; 21-5504

The Kansas anti-cruelty statutes define cruelty to animals as knowingly killing, injuring, maiming, torturing, burning or mutilating any animal. Also included as cruelty are abandoning any animal, failing to provide food, horse-tripping, and poisoning any domestic animal, unlawful disposition of animals, dog and cock-fighting. Cruelty to animals may be a misdemeanor or a felony. Exceptions are made for such things as veterinary practices, research experiments, rodeo and farming practices, euthanasia, and pest control. It is also illegal to allow a dangerous animal to run at large or to engage in sodomy with an animal.

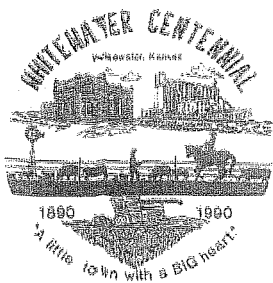

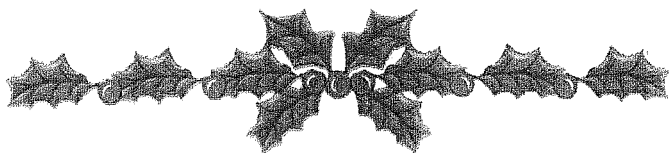

NORTH BUTLER 4-H

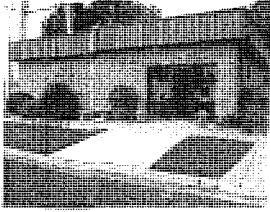

REMINDER:

City of Whitewater Code 7-204 Open Burning.

It shall be unlawful for any person to burn trash, rubbish, leaves, lumber, straw, grass, or other combustible material in any public grounds of the city, or to burn the same in any concrete gutter or on any street, alley improved by concrete or brick or asphaltic pavement or by petroleum products.

It shall be unlawful for any person to burn any trash, leaves, lumber, straw, paper, boxes, grass or other combustible materials openly within the fire limits of the city.

Burning of combustible materials may be authorized by issuance of a burning permit with conditions and restrictions stated thereon as determined by the chief of the fire department, his or her representative or authorized agents, where the reduction or disposal of such solid waste and where such burning would not be in conflict with state regulations. It shall be prima facie evidence that the person who owns or controls property on which burning occurs has caused or permitted the fire.

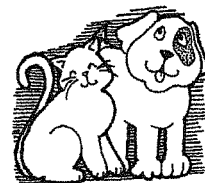

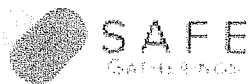
