## City Council Meeting Highlights from 12/23/24

The council has approved to consider to start the process to vacate the 20 ft alley along the front portion of the

property of 512 N. Main with the City of Whitewater reserving a right-of-way in that same portion to access utilities that are present. This will be seen by the Planning and Zoning Committee at their next meeting.

- Discussions were made concerning what is needed to be established as far as equipment and training to hire an Animal Control officer.
- The new mower has been purchased and delivered and mows "real nice".
   Old equipment continues to be sold off and the proceeds are going into the Equipment Fund.
- Andrew Hanna passed his Water Certification Test. Congrats!
- $\cdot\,$  The COOP has cut down their problematic trees and now have them piled up on their property. Thank you.
- Officer Moore reports five (5) traffic stops and one (1) ticket. He has seen an increase in Domestic Violence and Disturbance calls for both Whitewater and Potwin.
- The City Wide Cleanup is scheduled for March 22, 2025
- The city is partnering with the Loyd Group for the 2024 Audit.
- The city is adopting the 2024 Kansas Homeland Security Region G Hazard Mitigation Plan as the Hazard Mitigation Plan for the City of Whitewater.
- The council has approved the purchase of 3 fire hydrants with valves and hardware to start replacing the worst ones. Bids for installation are begin gathered.

#### TAKE A KINDER APPROACH TO YOUR GOALS

Often when it comes to goal-setting, we think it's all or nothing. We believe, 'I have to do this' or 'I have to be focused...' That is not necessarily the best or most successful way to achieve what you want. Instead, take the long view on goals. When pursuing goals, even a little progress means a lot. Take a kinder, more gentle approach.

Think about this: there are 168 hours in a week, how much of that time do you actually need to achieve your personal, financial, health, or other goals? Some things only take about an hour a week. You can make much progress on a project by spending an hour or two a week on a regular basis.

For example, if you want to read a book, but feel overwhelmed, spend just 5-10 minutes a day reading. Or if a goal is to get in better physical shape, dedicate 15-20 minutes a few times a week as an entry point.

This approach to goal-setting works when managing the family's finances, too. If you want to increase your family's emergency fund...what you could do is plan to put aside a small amount each month, perhaps as little as \$10 per month. That might not seem like a lot, but over a year, that's \$120 for your emergency fund that you didn't have previously.

It's important to share your goals as a family, particularly when it comes to spending money. When appropriate, involve kids, particularly as they grow older and transition into helping with such expenses as vehicles, insurance, weddings, and more. Sharing your goals as a family can allow for the family to work together, grow together, and keep one another accountable.

Sometimes – whatever goals you're setting – you don't take your intended actions. Don't beat yourself up. Wherever you're at, keep thinking ahead. Share your goals, write them down, and review them periodically; but don't obsess over them. Remember baby steps take a child from walking to running. Be kind to yourself and keep pushing forward.







# Whitewater River Consolidated Fire District



## Hope Everyone Had a Safe and Happy Holiday Season

2024 was a record-breaking year for the Whitewater River Consolidated Fire District with 185 total calls for the year. We gave mutual aid or automatic aid to 7 of our neighboring departments for a total of 49 calls and received mutual aid or automatic aid for a total of 54 calls. Some of these calls had multiple agencies responding at the same time to specific calls such as large grass fires or structure fires. Without everyone helping each other, we could not get the incident taken care of safely and efficiently.

With the Butler County side of the district changing over to Butler County EMS coverage for medical calls, the response times were not as significant as we were all afraid of. On average, Whitewater saw about 4 minutes, Elbing about 8 minutes, Milton Township was about 4 minutes and Fairmount saw the longest delay of about 12 minutes longer. Butler County EMS responded about 79 times to our fire district and Newton EMS responded about 15 times to Richland and Pleasant Townships. Butler County EMS also responded to Wheat State Manor about 56 times for less critical calls that the fire district did not respond.

The Fire District had our annual end of the year supper for the Volunteer Fire Personnel, Board Members and their wives. Special Thanks to Ed and Chris Flora and Aubrey Kinsley for the use of 201 Main for our annual supper this year.
