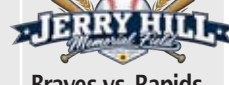

August City Council Highlights

Mayor Eldredge presided over the Revenue Neutral Rate Hearing, 2027 Budget Hearing, and regular City Council Meeting on August 24.

2027 Budget & Revenue Neutral Rate

The Council approved Resolution No. 0824-26, establishing the City's property tax rate at 57.807 mills and exceeding the Revenue Neutral Rate. The 2027 City Budget was also approved.

Chicken Ordinance Review

The Council continued discussing possible changes, including increasing the number of chickens, registration deadlines and late fees, and coop location requirements.

The Council would like to hear from residents before making any changes. Share your thoughts by attending the September 28 Council Meeting or submitting a letter to the City Office.

Fred Fest & WIBL Updates

The Council approved reinstating year-to-year matching funds for the Fred Fest fireworks display. WIBL Opening Day brought three games to Jerry Hill Memorial Ballfield, with additional games scheduled throughout the season, including two during Fred Fest.

Public Safety Update

Deputy Tom Moore reported several recent cases, including a warrant arrest, domestic violence, and a violation of a court order. A theft involving copper and wiring from a downtown business is also under investigation.

Deputy Moore has been monitoring traffic near the school and reported no speeding concerns. However, residents are reminded that children should not be driving golf carts or ATVs to school.

City & Maintenance Updates

Planning & Zoning meets September 8 to continue work on updated bylaws and an Annexation Ordinance. More than 50 permits have been issued in 2026, primarily roofing permits following this summer's hailstorm. KOOP Painting completed improvements to several City properties, and the City's summer employees have completed their seasonal work.

The City continues monitoring El Dorado's annual water supply burnout. Following repairs in Potwin, Whitewater's water flow has returned to normal. The KDHE inspection identified required updates to the City's Emergency Water Supply Plan and annual backflow inspection reporting.

City Shop Roof

The Council approved Whalen Roofing's \$11,694 bid to replace the metal roof panels at the City Shop.

Looking Ahead

The next City Council Meeting is **Monday, September 28, 2026, at 7:00 PM**. Expected topics include Planning & Zoning ordinances and bylaws, the Chicken Ordinance, City policy updates, and a brainstorming session.

All are welcome at City Council meetings. Public Comment time is available at the beginning of each meeting; Please keep it to 5 minutes per person when addressing the council.

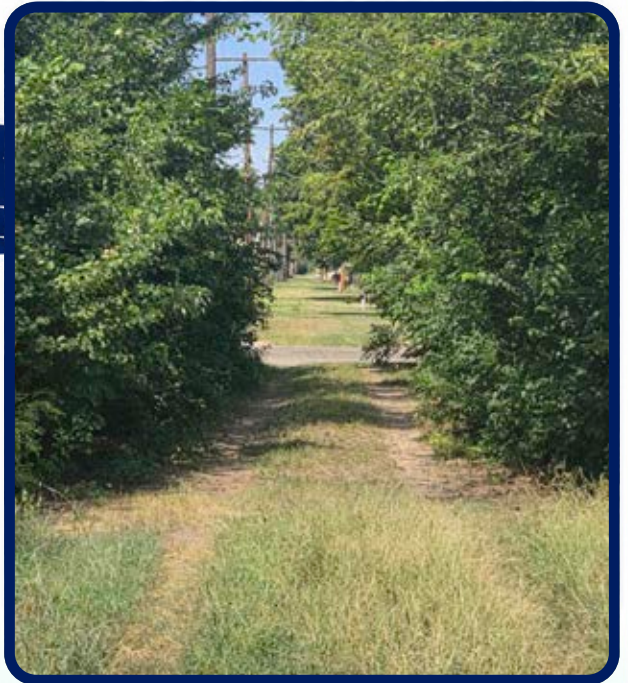
HEY WHITEWATER...

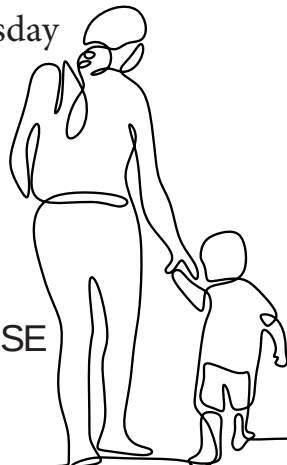

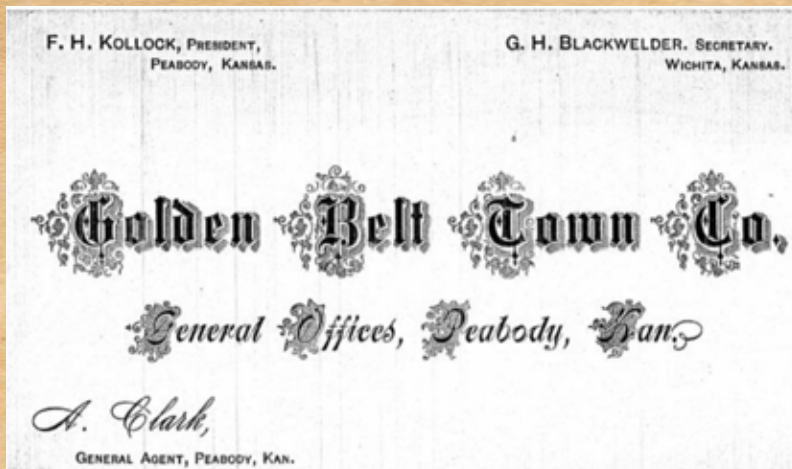

HISTORY HIGHLIGHTED Town Companies



E.L. Neal wrote in a 1935 history of Whitewater, "The town site of Whitewater was laid out in 1887 by the Golden Belt Town Company, on land owned by G.P. Nieman."

Town companies had contributing roles in the founding of the new towns of the time. The company would speculate on land and acquire specific locations to accommodate the railroad. Those locations would be surveyed, platted for towns, and prepared for sale. The railroads were not interested in owning or organizing town sites.

We know that Mr. Nieman maintained ownership of the land platted for the town of Whitewater. In that case, the town company served as agents to warrant that records were complete, deeds were properly filed, and obligations to the County were met. They gave direction for elections of town officials and assisted in the initial town management. Their responsibilities were terminated once the official town government was recognized by the county and had sufficiently assumed their duties.

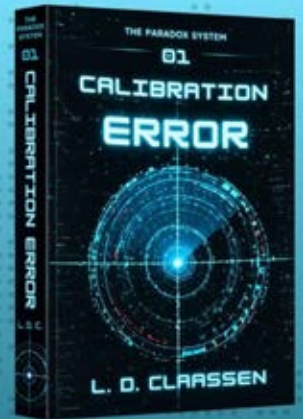

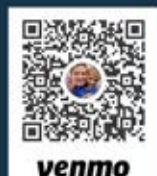

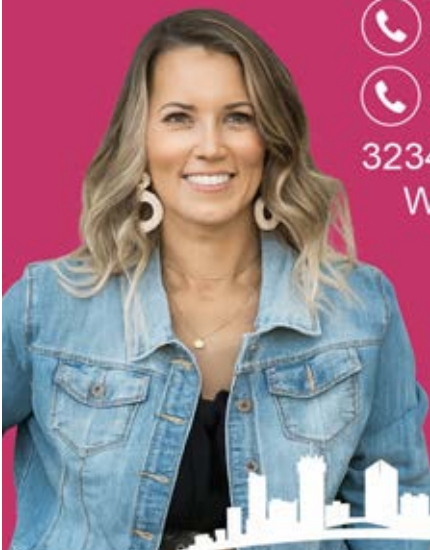
