Hearings & City Council Meeting Highlights from 8/25/25

Full minutes will be posted upon approval: whitewaterks.gov

- The governing body agreed to exceed the RNR and accept the proposed 2026 Budget with the mill-levy of 55.809.
- Ken Stringer's resignation letter was read aloud at the council meeting. The Mayor recommended Jeff Artman to fill the vacancy. The council unanimously agreed. Artman will fill the vacancy but will not accept the position beyond this year. The seat is up for election in November.
- Public addressed the council in both the hearings and council meeting; topics: Alleyway flooding, keep the police, better street repair/replacement plan, better lift-station planning and sewer issues, fall baseball to use ballfield 1, and a thank you note from Bruce and Kathy Trapp.
- The governing body passed a resolution to allocate the utility late charge funds into the Sewer Reserve Fund, retroactive to Jan. 1, 2025. Resolution 0825-25B can be found on the city website. whitewaterks.gov/resolutions
- The governing body also passed Ordinance 641; which amends some of the City Codes concerning the animal control and regulations to include the word "surrender" and procedures of the animal claims and surrendering. Read the full Ordinance at whitewaterks.gov/city-codes-ordinances
- Deputy's Report 3 verbal warnings and a ticket for going 50 in a 20. More
 officers are going to be in the area now that school has started back up.
- Clerk's Report Next Court date is Sept. 16 at 10AM. A new FEEDBACK FORM allows people to complain, compliment or make a suggestion on how the city is doing. A Renter's Utility Application has also been created.
- Maintenance Report No leaks this month. A zip tie was found jammed in the coin machine at the car wash - please use QUARTERS ONLY in the quarter slot.
- The governing body adopted a Comprehensive Fee Schedule through Ordinance 642, this will allow any fee changes to be passed through resolutions and be reviewed annually.
- · Budget requests were reviewed and allocations were made.

The Claassen-Thiessen Family by Darryl Claassen

In 1876.

Justine & Eduard Claassen Dietrich and Maria Claassen arrived in Butler County, Kansas. They were accompanied by their immediate family of six sons, one daughter, and one daughter-in-law. They set about purchasing land and establishing farm steads. This family initially settled on Sections 29 and 33 of Milton Township - an area south of the future towns of Brainerd and Whitewater. A few years later, in 1888, Heinrich Thiessen brought his young family to the area. He was

able to purchase three guarters of Section 10 of Milton Township, north of the new town of Brainerd. Claassen will present a history of these two families and how their relationship impacted his existence. Claassen will also tell how he is almost related to three other Claassen clans.

The Frederic Remington Area Historical Society (FRAHS) is a membership organization and not-for-profit corporation, filed June 21, 1978. This corporation is exempt from federal income tax under 501(c)(3) Revenue Codes of 1954. Membership runs from September to May; dues are announced at meetings.

The primary purpose of FRAHS is to collect, preserve, and share the Frederic Remington USD 206 School District area's rich history and culture with its residents, students, and other interested persons. A majority of the society's programs each year are to fulfill that purpose, while other programs should inform attendees of state and national topics of historical and cultural interests.



LIVING WELL WEDNESDAY

Kansas State University's popular Living Well Wednesday webinar series returns this fall! The free webinars are held the third Wednesday of each month from September through November. The sessions begin at 12:10 p.m., with the virtual room opening at noon to allow participants time to log in, grab lunch and get settled. Registration is free and available at bit.ly/41E7kqJ. You also can search 'Living Well Wednesday Extension' and the information will pop right up.

The 2025 fall series kicks off **September 17** with a webinar on fentanyl and opioid awareness, presented by Jenni Ebert, a community health educator with the Riley County Health Department. Jenny will explain how one pill can kill. Fentanyl can be lethal even with a first use. It only takes about two milligrams, or five to seven grains of salt. She helps people understand how to be more aware of those dangers and what they can do to protect themselves and their families.

On **October 15**, the focus turns to recognizing, avoiding and reporting scams, with Ed Burr, an investigator with the Kansas Attorney General's office. He will go into detail about how to recognize and avoid a scam, but also what to do if you are a victim. Scams can have devastating financial and emotional consequences.

November 19, the series will address energy drinks, a timely topic for families, students and health-conscious individuals. Energy drinks are high in caffeine, sugar, and other stimulants. While they may provide a short-term energy boost, they can also lead to heart issues, anxiety, and even insomnia or gastrointestinal problems. Youth, pregnant women, and people on medications should be especially cautious.





Banana Style WiffleBall

Open to Teams with a Variety of Ages: note, it is possible you may play a team of all adults.

First inning: Kickball + Kickball rules

Second Inning: Wiffle + Run bases backwards 3B>2B>1B>Home

Third Inning: Tennis ball + wood bat + no gloves on D.

Fourth Inning: Wiffle + Anything but a Bat - Bring your own item

Fifth Inning: Wiffle + opposite handed hitting/throwing

----if more time remains, cycle back to top-----





>>>>> FRED FEST: SAT, OCT 4TH

RULE 1: 40MIN TIME LIMIT; 5 FIELDERS (+ RULE 7): bat (roster) as many as you'd like; 3 outs/side.

RULE 2: WIN THE INNING, GET THE POINT: earn 1 point for having the most runs in an inning

RULE 3: NO WALKS: Ball 4 = try to get to first before being tagged or before the ball gets there.

RULE 4: NO BUNTING, BUNTING IS BORING

RULE 5: FOULS: If a fan catches a foul it is an out.

RULE 6: NO THROWS HOME, RUN IT IN: to get an out at home you must run the ball in.



The Whitewater River CFD has been busy again this year. We have had one Junior Firefighter and two others Volunteers join the department in August to bring our membership up to 15. In addition to the 112 emergency responses, our volunteers have been actively involved in training, community events, and inter-agency collaboration. We have had 17 regular fire drill/trainings, with an 7 additional training sessions the volunteers could attend.

February

- Volunteer Firefighter Chris Hall was recognized at the Butler County Lifesave Banquet for his heroic efforts during a medical call involving cardiac arrest. Chris assisted with CPR, and thanks to the swift response of first responders, the patient survived and was released from the hospital days later.
- Proudly supported the Remington High School Wrestlers as they headed off to compete at the State level.
- Co-hosted a Hazmat Awareness Training in Potwin, attended by volunteers from Burns, Benton, Towanda, Potwin, and Whitewater Fire Departments.

April

- Hosted the 2025 Storm Fury on the Plains program, presented by Butler County Emergency Management.
- Tested and maintained over 8,000 feet of fire hose.
- Volunteers attended Wichita Firefighter Voth's funeral at Hartman Arena to honor his service and sacrifice.

May

- Helped send off the Remington High School Baseball and Track Teams to their State events.
- Participated in the dignified transport of Butler County EMS Paramedic Justin Lauppe, who passed away while on duty. Several of our members also attended his funeral. Paramedic Lauppe was a dedicated professional who had provided valuable training to our department over the past year and a half. His loss is deeply felt across the first responder community.

July

- Took part in the Whitewater Memorial Library summer event, treating local children to a fun spray-down from one of our fire trucks.
- Completed inspection and flushing of the 11 fire hydrants in the City of Elbing.

August

- Conducted inspection and flushing of the 42 fire hydrants in the City of Whitewater, along with 2 rural hydrants.
- Hosted a family cookout and gathering at the Good's residence. Volunteers and their families enjoyed an evening of swimming, games, playing with their animals, and great company.
- Helped provided fire protection for participants at the Harvey County Demo Derby, to help ensure a safe environment for the drivers and spectators.
- Participated in Potwin's Watermelon Festival by entering two fire trucks in the parade, proudly representing Whitewater River CFD in the community celebration.
