Council member, Ken Stringer addressed the council with cost of water/sewer charges for those with inground sprinklers. Tabled to April. Council reviewed water contract (1979-2029) with Potwin. Deputy, Tom Moore has been in training and new computers installed in police vehicles. Maintenance, Don Berg shared that the sign on Hwy 196 repaired. Mayer Specialties starting east third of the city for sewer. RHS Softball and Baseball starts. A motion approved to order 1 handicap & 1 regular port pot for the summer months to have at ball diamonds. City Clerk, Heather Thiel has been working with Cherry Blossom Bookkeeping Solutions to update Quick Books for all city accounting. City Clean Up 7/29/23 and City Wide Garage Sales 6/9-6/10/23. Newton Fire/EMS tabled to April. Council was adjourned.

Citywide Summer Clean-up

Waste Connections will make one pass thru the city.
Items must be brought to the street for curbside pickup
Waste Connections requests all items to be collected
be set at the curb prior to 7:30am, July 29th

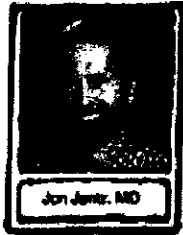
Waste Connections asks that all items being collected need to be able to be handled by two people safely. General trash, small amounts of bundled brush or limbs, furniture including, chairs, couches, tables. Appliances including, washers, dryers, dishwashers, microwaves, small electrical appliances such as TV's, computers, mixers, blenders. Patio grills, patio furniture, push lawn mowers (free of gas & oil) and lawn trimmers. Tree limbs and branches must be cut in 3 foot lengths and bundled for easy pickup. Any trash not in the trash cart must be in throwaway containers such as boxes or bags, no more than 30-gallon capacity. No loose trash or debris will be picked up, or box or bag exceeding 40 pounds in weight.

Here is a list of items NO LANDFILL OR TRANSFER STATION will accept:

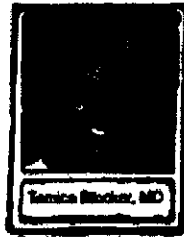
Car batteries, oil filters, fluorescent light bulbs, propane tanks, any asbestos materials, explosives, paint (we will take empty & dried up paint cans), no hazardous liquids (such as fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, solvents, diesel fuel, gas, oil, transmission fluid, antifreeze, etc.) tires. REFRIGERATORS, FREEZERS AND AIR CONDITIONERS must be tagged by a technician and must have the appropriate paper work with it in order for Waste Connections to pick it up.

Throughout what appears to be an increasing trend in disasters and other major emergencies, there have been many examples of the important role that citizens play in their communities during these events — and this includes the response to last year's EF-3 tornado. As emergency responders and government resources are stretched and sometimes overwhelmed, neighbors repeatedly step up to help neighbors in need.

As you have watched these stories play out, have you wondered how you could be better prepared to help your friends, family and neighbors (and beyond) in a disaster? If so, consider participating in a CERT Class!

This spring Butler County Emergency Management is once again offering the free 20-hour Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Basic Class. Through a combination of classroom presentations, hands-on activities, and a final disaster scenario, this course equips citizens to “bridge the gap” between a community's needs and available help.





Whitewater River Consolidated Fire District

The Whitewater River Consolidated Fire District hosted a Basic First Aid, CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) and AED (Automated External Defibrillator) training event for the community that was presented by Liz and Mike Claassen. The event was held at the Whitewater Fire District Office on April 25th. A lot of good



information was presented about recognizing when a person is having a cardiac event, as well as when and how to perform CPR. There was also a hands-on portion of the training where participants were able to practice performing CPR on baby, juvenile and adult manikins. They

were able to utilize a trainer AEDs so they could become familiar how to operate one. Thanks to all that attended. Special Thanks to Liz and Mike Claassen for taking the time out of their evening to present the training event.



The Whitewater River CFD responded to 34 calls the first quarter of 2023. In the month of April, the fire department has responded to 25 calls ranging from Citizen Assist, grass fires, medical calls, a vehicle accident, a structure fire and mutual aid calls. On April 7th, the department had a total of 5 alarms, there were 6 separate fires along the railroad between NW 170th and K196 along with a mutual aid call to assist Walton Fire with a brush fire and two additional grass fire calls on K196. There were several other days in April where the department responded to multiple grass fires and mutual aid alarms.

Even with the limited volunteers that are available during the daytime, we have been able to staff trucks to take care of the fires in our district. The Potwin Fire Department was requested to assist with one of these grass fires in our Fire District. Walton Fire and Potwin Fire were also requested for mutual aid to assist with water supply at the structure fire.



We were invited to bring Engine 82 to Berean Academy on May 5th for their field day. This has become an annual event for Berean Academy to invite Whitewater River CFD to come over and spray the

kids down. They really enjoy it, even on the years that it has been pretty cool outside.



The Whitewater River Consolidated Fire District is always looking for volunteers who have the desire to volunteer a few hours per month to help our neighbors at their time of need. If you are interested in joining the department, feel free to stop by the District Office, come to a fire drill or call (316) 799-2121 to see what it's all about. Our fire drills are the 1st and 3rd Wednesday at 7pm, either at the District Office or the Whitewater Fire Station.

It provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands.

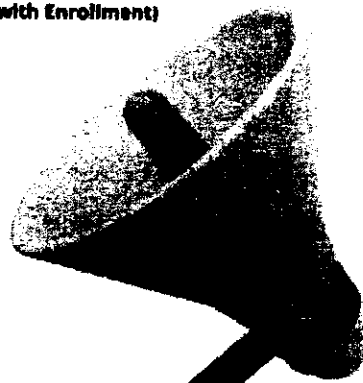
