Whitewater River Consolidated Fire District

The Whitewater River CFD responded to 12 calls for service in the month of July that included medical calls, 2 structure fires (very minimal damage to either structure), an electrical fire at SE 84th Street and East Lake Road (Butler Rural Electric Sub-Station), 2 false alarms and 2 mutual aid calls to Potwin that we were disregarded from before we got on scene.

The department had our regular scheduled drills on July 5th and July 19th. The July 5th drill, we reviewed our rescue tools, including the battery-operated Spreader (Jaws of Life), Cutters, Air Bag System as well as several others. We then watched a Lithium-Ion Battery training video. In the past month and a half, we have responded to two battery related fires. On the July 19th drill, we conducted a rescue of three victims (mannequins) from mock vehicle accident where we utilized most of our rescue tools.

As many probably already know, the Cities of Whitewater and Elbing along with Milton and Fairmount Townships have contracted with the City of Newton Fire/EMS services for approximately 25 years. The cities and townships have been in negotiations over the past several months with the City of Newton to continue with their ambulance services and have been unable to negotiate a viable contract. In January of 2024, Butler County EMS will start responding for our ambulance service. Richland Township and the south half of Pleasant Townships (Harvey County) that are within the Whitewater Fire District will continue to utilize the City of Newton EMS ambulance services.

With this being said, I believe the ambulance services will continue to remain at very high standards, but the response times will increase the further north in the district they have to respond. Also, depending on the location the Butler County Ambulance responds from (El Dorado, Andover or Augusta) will determine their response times. The Whitewater Fire District has been and continues to talk with both City of Newton Fire/EMS and Butler County EMS representatives to discuss options within our fire district that will benefit the citizens within our fire district.

In addition, about 25 years ago, all landline 911 calls within the (then) City of Whitewater Fire Department's response area were automatically routed to the Harvey County 911 Communications Center, but this has changed in more recent years. Depending on the location the call is placed and your phone service provider will determine which dispatch center will answer your 911 call.

Over the past couple of months, the Fire District has also been working with both Harvey County and Butler County 911 Communications Centers to find a solution to receive notification (dispatching) of emergency calls within our fire district. The two counties utilize different frequencies to page our responders to emergencies so this has generated additional issues we are working through.

Whitewater Fire District has been maintaining right at fifteen volunteers on the roster. Most of these volunteers work outside of our fire district and are unable to respond during the daytime, which is a common theme among most volunteer fire departments throughout the country. Currently, we have two volunteers in the Elbing area that consistently respond to calls during the daytime hours and many times there are only one or two available in the Whitewater area. This makes it even more important to maintain good working relationships with surrounding fire departments and maintain mutual aid and automatic aid agreements with our neighboring departments and counties.

If you (male or female) are interested in volunteering a few hours a month, feel free to stop by the District Office, come to a fire drill or call (316) 799-2121 to see what it's all about. Our fire drills are the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month at 7pm, either at the District Office or the Whitewater Fire Station.

- Frederic Remington lived on a sheep ranch between Whitewater and Peabody between 1883-1885.
- Remington hated sheep ranching but loved sketching. Though he tried other business ventures, it was his sketches that brought in income.
- By 1886, Harper's Weekly was publishing his sketches and sent him to New Mexico to record the war against Geronimo.
- It was Remington's ability to draw life-like action that gave him critical acclaim, while his sculptures captured the drama and intensity of the Western cowboy.

Today we honor Frederic Remington with our local community festival. Our Art Show pays homage to a home-grown artist.

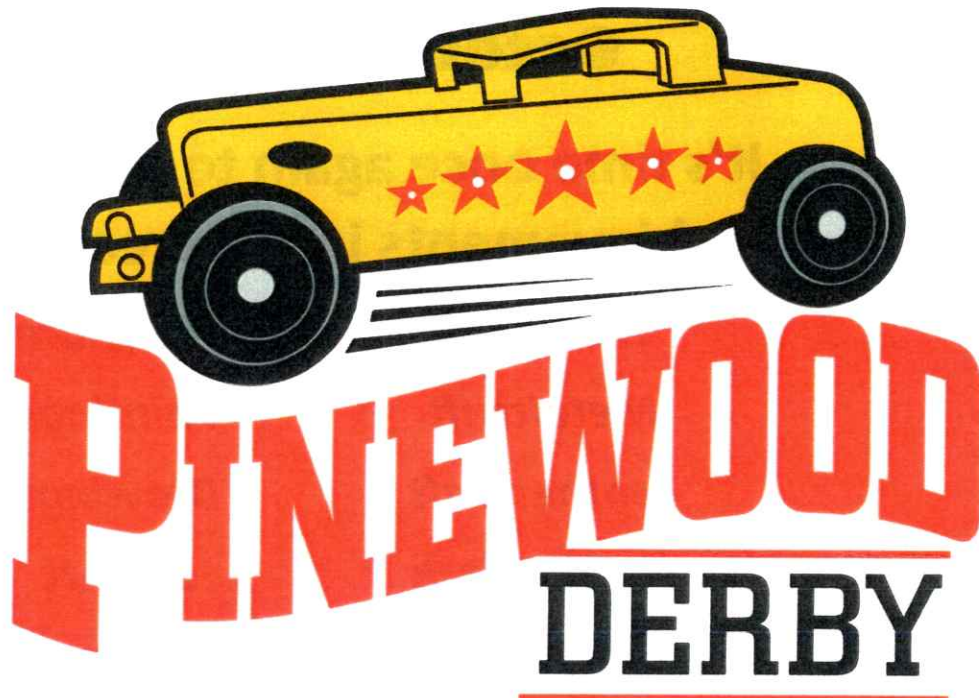

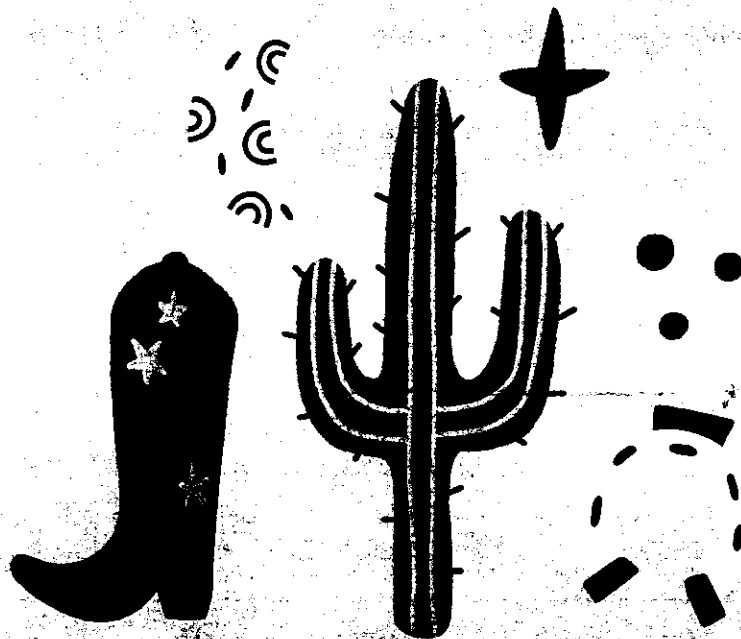

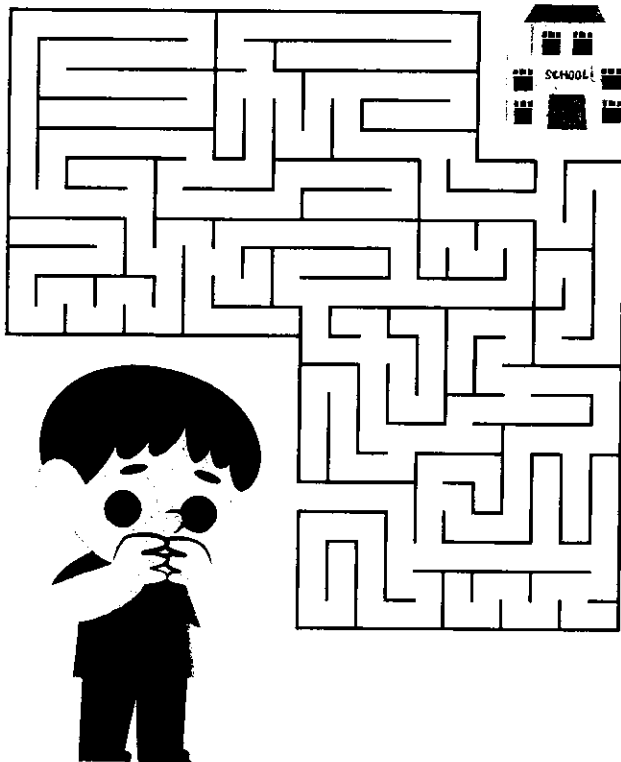
