Whitewater River Consolidated Fire District

The Whitewater River CFD responded to 14 calls for service in the month of August. They included 7 medical calls, 3 grass fires, a vehicle accident, a false alarm, a citizen assists and a mutual aid call to Benton's District. We had our two regular fire drills and added a special drill where we received our new Automatic External Defibrillator and received training on it's use.

The training will familiarize you on what to do if a loved one or if you are present when someone has a cardiac event. There will be CPR mannequins available to practice CPR and applying an AED. Everyone is invited to participate. There will **NOT** be a certification with this training. The training should take approximately one hour, depending on questions and number of participants.

The Fire Department will have some kids water games at Ball Field #3 (by the Scout House) weather permitting from 2:30 to 3:30 pm. All ages can participate if they want to get wet.

If you (male or female) are interested in volunteering a few hours a month, feel free to stop by the District Office, come to a fire drill or call (316) 799-2121 to see what it's all about. Our fire drills are the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month at 7pm, either at the District Office or the Whitewater Fire Station.

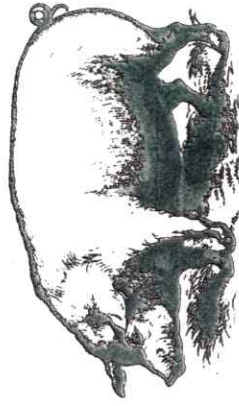

Dee and Phyllis knew the Merrill and Davis Ranch families and will share stories about the Z-Bar brand, moving cattle between the ranches, trips to the Bottoms (stockyards) in KC, and more. Tours of the house, barn and outbuildings, prairie nature walk, and Visitor Center included. 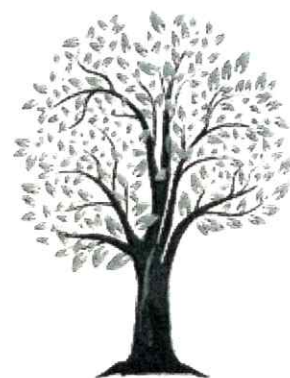

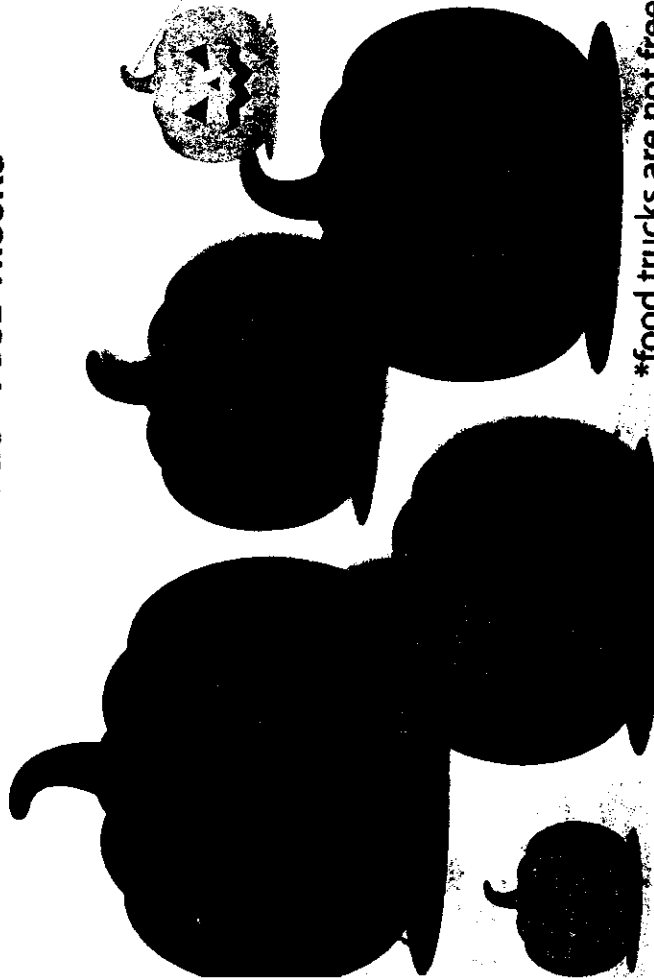

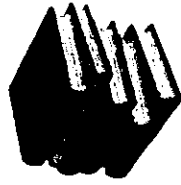

Festival Parade Info

Ways to enter town (to avoid closed streets):

- 1) From K196 Highway – enter on Elm Street, go north to Vine, east to Oak, and north to Central
- 2) From Butler Road – enter on Central, west to Oak

And where to line up (to avoid closed streets):

From Central and Oak, go north to 2nd Street, west to Main, and south to Central

Parade route – south on Main from Central to Wheat State Manor, using the manor circle drive as a turn-around. Double-back on Main St. to Kansas St., and east on Kansas to Elm to exit the parade.

The parade will be led by the Scouts presenting the Flags,

Followed by marching bands,

Followed by Law Enforcement Agencies,

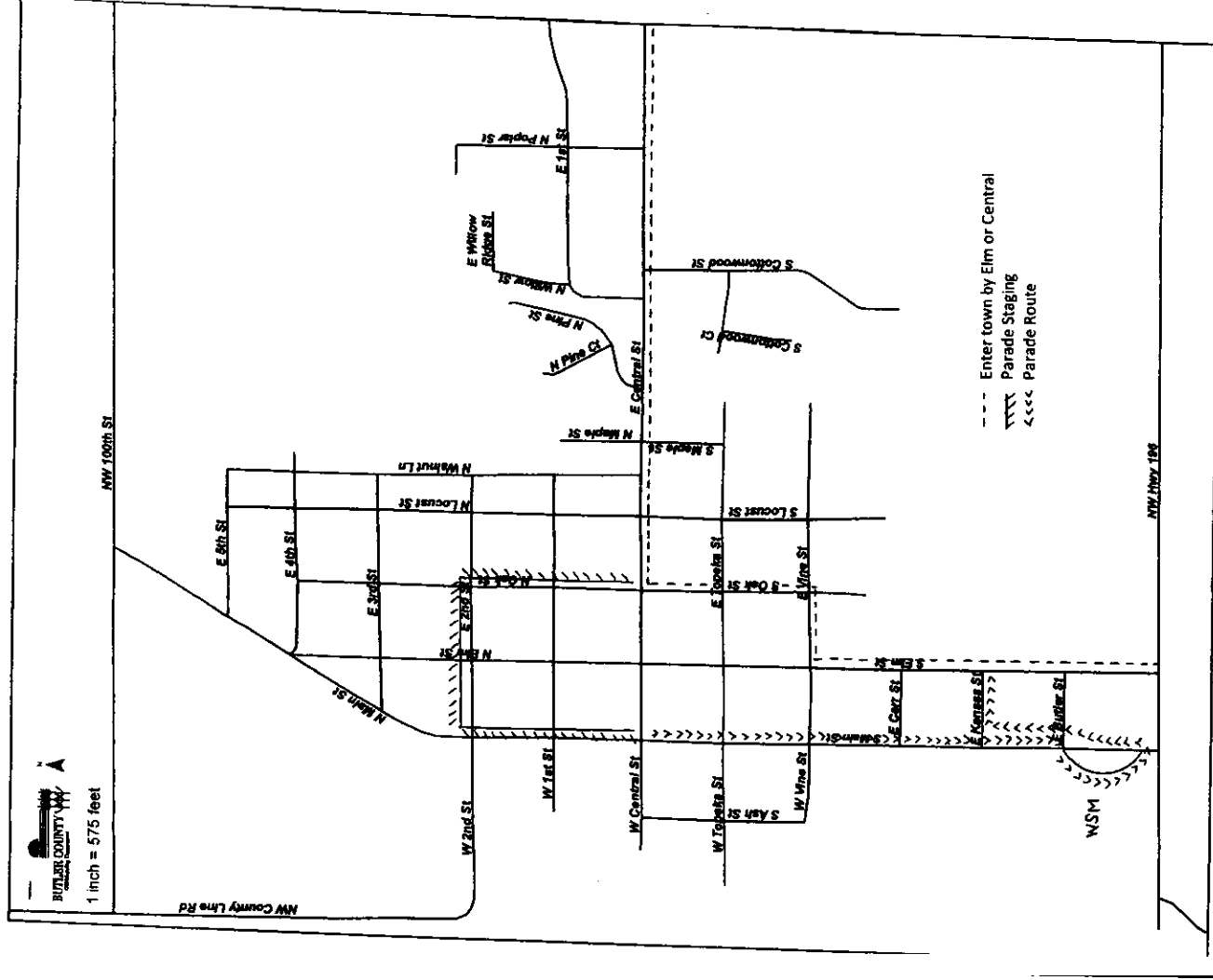
Followed by the Whitewater River Fire District

All other parade entries will proceed in the order of arrival. Exception: Horses will be grouped and entered at the end of the parade.

All emergency vehicles will parade with emergency lights only. No sirens or air horns will be allowed from any parade entries, including emergency vehicles.

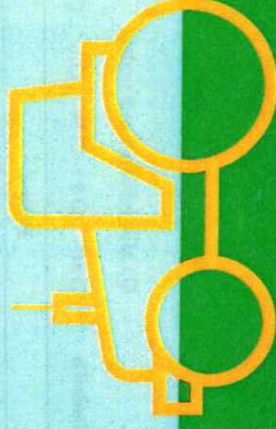

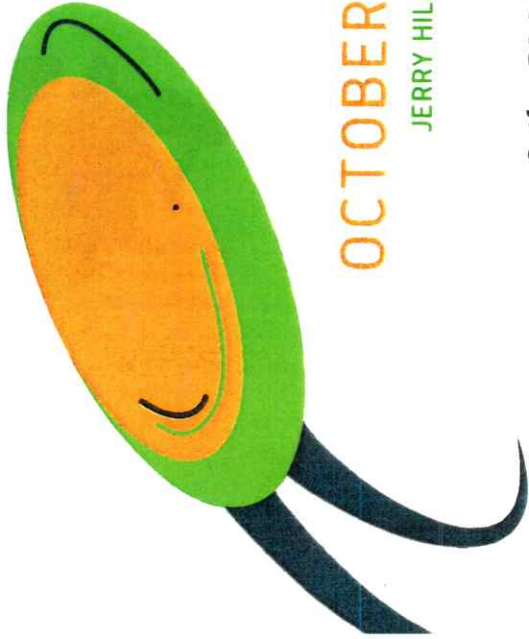

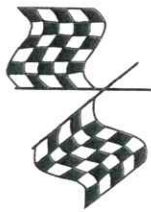
