Whitewater River Consolidated Fire District

The Whitewater River CFD responded to 13 calls for service in the month of September. They included 6 medical calls, a vehicle accident, a farm equipment fire in our response area. We also sent trucks to a mutual aid call in Potwin's District for a grass fire but were disregarded. We responded to several Mutual aid calls in the Benton's Fire District, including a trash fire, a structure fire and a call of a reported accident just inside Benton's District where a cell phone fell off a vehicle and it called 911 to report a hard impact. The phone was found unharmed and returned to the owner.

The Whitewater River Consolidated Fire District was awarded a grant from the Kansas Governor's Grant Program to assist with purchasing 20 new pagers so we can receive pager notification from both Harvey and Butler County 911 Communications Centers. We were also approved funds to upgrade/replace 10 portable 800MHz radios. The grant award from the Kansas Governor's Grant Program totaled \$58,950.

The WRCFD had a busy day during the Frederic Remington Festival. We had 5 trucks in the parade and after the parade, we opened our doors for the public to stop by and meet some of our Volunteers and see our trucks. Butler County EMS and Rescue Squad were also in town for the festival with a Medic Unit and Heavy Rescue Truck (Special Thanks to them). We hosted a CPR/AED public training event with Stuart Funk (Butler County EMS), Liz and Mike Claassen instructing during the afternoon. We also took some trucks down to the Scout House for some water games with the kids.

Frederic Remington Area Historical Society 2023-2024 Programs

October 9, 2023 (note date change to 2nd Monday to coincide with Fred Fest weekend)

“Whitewater High School Senior Trips” by Darryl Claassen

Program co-sponsored by Friends of Whitewater Memorial Library

Centre Point Church in Whitewater, 7:00 PM

Beginning with a two-day trip in 1934, the Senior trips of Whitewater High School became legendary. The logistics of organizing and scheduling trips for graduating Seniors was nothing short of phenomenal. The trips were each two or three weeks long so required physical and mental discipline. The success of these trips is validated by the repetition for 29 years – save three years due to the war. Darryl Claassen has collected information and photographs on these trips.

November 6, 2023

“Pushin’ Horns” by Jim Gray, The Cowboy

Remington High Band room, 7:00 PM

Pushin' Horns is a snapshot of the everyday life of 19th-century cowboys (drovers), from gathering wild cattle to the delivery of the cattle at the Kansas railheads. Throughout his life, Gray has collected the stories and lived the life, gaining intimate knowledge of cowboy life on the cattle trails to Kansas and beyond. The Cowboy's presentation is sure to put flesh and blood onto the bones of old trail stories; buried but not forgotten.

February 5, 2024

“The Busenitz Family” by Susan Busenitz Carp

David and Susan (Busenitz) Carp will share select diary entries her grandmother Justine (Wiebe) Busenitz wrote to chronicle her life with her husband John and their eleven children. The diary begins about eight years after the families of Justine and John came to America in 1893 and spans a little more than fifty years. Susan and David live in Wichita and have deep family roots in both the Wichita and Whitewater communities.

March 4, 2024

“Frederic Remington in Kansas” by Doug Claassen

Remington High Band room, 7:00 PM

Iconic Western Artist Frederic Remington attempted a career as a sheep rancher in Kansas. His time in northwestern Butler County was short, but his failure as a sheep rancher influenced his life's work and left a mark on the community.

April 1, 2024

“Local Ranches on the Prairie” by Marcia Sebree

Remington High Band room, 7:00 PM, Elections

The Flint Hills represent a vast expanse of tallgrass prairie that extends into Marion County providing the perfect setting for large ranches with premium grazing land. Marcia will tell about some of the ranches and farms in the area that produced cattle, sheep, and some of the finest horses in the country. Marcia Sebree is the President of the Peabody (Kansas) Historical Society and the Director of the Peabody Historical Society and Museum complex.

May 4, 2024 (note date is Saturday)

Tour – Tallgrass Prairie Preserve/Z-Bar Ranch, 2480B KS-177, Strong City, 9am-2pm

“A Look-back at Ranching in the Red Hills” by Dee and Phyllis Sherich, former ranch managers of the Merrill Ranch in southwest Kansas (Red/Gyp Hills area). Harold Merrill was at one time a business partner with George Davis, former owner of the Z-Bar Ranch. Dee and Phyllis knew the Merrill and Davis Ranch families and will share stories about the Z-Bar brand, moving cattle between the ranches, trips to the Bottoms (stockyards) in KC, and more. Tours of the house, barn and outbuildings, prairie nature walk, and Visitor Center included. More information and registration will be provided at meetings and on social media as the year progresses.
